Reading with and alongside your children:

We all know how busy life can be for everyone but I want to remind Parents and Carers of the crucial importance of your child practising their reading at home on a regular basis. Recent studies have shown that less and less primary aged children are reading at home and this is a huge worry to us at The Coppice. I always say that reading is the 'key to the door' that makes learning easier and opens up opportunities. Unfortunately, we are all too aware of the many 'screen' distractions that children now have that can often make getting them to enjoy reading harder. Please therefore, try to make time for your child to read every day and continue to read with them, to them and alongside them because it will, undoubtedly, benefit them in many different ways. If you are struggling to get your child to read, please talk to your child's Class Teacher who can help signpost you to different types of books that your child could try. We have a wealth of quality books in school and there will always be something for everyone!

National Poetry Day

It was a joy for me this week to visit all Year 1 and 2 classes in order to read some poems as part of the celebration of National Poetry Day yesterday. I read a number of poems to the children that showed how poems can be funny, thoughtful and tell a story. Among the poems I read were ones called 'The Dinosaur's Dinner', 'Spaghetti, Spaghetti', 'The Three Billy Goats' Grump Grump Grump rap' and 'Treasures'. At the end of each session, I challenged some of the children to either find a poem and read it, write a poem or perform a poem. It was therefore a huge pleasure to be visited by a group of Year 2 children, who had done just that! It's always a fantastic feeling, as a teacher, when children are inspired to do something off their own backs at home – well done children!

Mr. Laight also shared poems with Years 3 and 4 in his assembly and Mrs. Ashwell did the same with Years 5 and 6 – I know how much the older children enjoyed her 'Granny rap'!

Poetry is an area of language that can bring both children and adults so much in different ways and therefore it is something that we really want to ensure our children are exposed to.

Myles is a screenwriter, author and poet; and Greg is an illustrator, director and animator. As the Brothers McLeod, they have written, produced and directed short films, children's series and numerous other original animations. During the visit, they talked to their children about their series of books The Knight Sir Louis, as well as their experiences and inspirations for their stories, illustrations and animations.

The assembly and workshop were fantastic! They read to the children from their hilarious new book: The Sinister Snowball, and then the children worked together to design a new character and storyboard. The hall was filled with laughter throughout the visit. Our guests complimented Coppice children on their energy, enthusiasm and creativity!

Myles and Greg also signed bookplates for their books for children whose families had ordered them. We are hugely grateful to the McLeod brothers and to our friends at Bookwagon, who organised the visit, for giving the children an hilarious afternoon to remember.

Tuesday 10th October is World Mental Health Day and, as a school, we are marking it by doing some different activities in school. All classes will be participating in mindfulness activities e.g. mindfulness colouring, singing, playing music, listening to stories, doing yoga exercises etc. Basically, the children will be doing things that help them to feel relaxed. To reassure you all, our focus on the day will be on how we can try to relax and feel good about ourselves rather than discussing the complex issues related to mental health as this could be difficult for some children. We will mention, however, just how important it is for the children to talk to a trusted person if they have any worries, concerns, fears etc. This is linked to the 'Get Britain Talking' campaign that many of you will have seen a lot on the television recently.

We are also asking all children and staff to wear an item of yellow to complement their usual uniform or work clothes e.g. a scarf, badge, tie, socks, hat etc to show support and raise awareness.
