

The Coppice Whole School Newsletter Friday 11th July 2025

Dear Parents and Carers.

As always, I hope that you have all had a good week and are very much looking forward to the weekend with your children - once again it's going to be hot! As with last week, we've had another great week in school and there is again much to tell you all.

Year 6 SAT results - well done children!

We received our Year 6 SAT results this week and are thrilled with how our children performed. These are the statutory tests that all Year 6 children are required to undertake. After the children completed them in May, they were then sent away to be externally and independently marked. This is the same process for all schools across the

country.

The figures in bold below are The Coppice figures and the figure in brackets are the national average figures.

You will obviously therefore see how well The Coppice children have performed against other children nationally. Our results were as follows:

In **Writing**, which is not sent away but is teacher-assessed in school (the same as for all schools nationally), we achieved **79%** at the expected standard (72% nationally) and **15%** at the Higher Standard (13% nationally)

We are very proud of our Year 6 children for their achievements and a huge well done goes to all of them! They all did their very best and their attitude towards their assessments was first class! A huge thank you and well done also goes to all of the Teachers and Teaching Assistants who have taught these children over the years. All of them have contributed greatly to the children's successes.

Coppice Summer Revel – a great success despite the weather!

Art Ambassadors visit Woodrush!

Our Art Ambassadors returned from Woodrush very excited on Tuesday afternoon after experiencing a range of art activities in the Woodrush art rooms.

The children got to experience a technique called 'Gelli printing'. Gelli Plate Printing uses a gelatin plate to press to fabric or paper. The process is easy as the paint is put on the gelli surface, spread out with a brayer then a variety of stencils and other textureal objects are placed on the gelli plate, removed and placed on the fabric. This then leaves an incredibly vivid image when placed on a pre-painted background.

I think you'll all agree that the children's end products were extremely impressive. A huge thank goes to Woodrush for inviting our children.
