### **Reach More Parents Communication App – Important:**

We have been thrilled with the take up so far for our 'Reach More Parents' app. As of yesterday, 68% of our children have had one or more Parent or Carers had signing up to it, which is absolutely fantastic – thank you so much to everyone who has done this! We are really excited about this next step in ensuring that our communication with you is really clear and all contained in one simple to use system

### Celebration assemblies:

On Wednesday and Thursday of this week, we held our Celebration Assembles for Years 1-6 where we celebrated all of the excellent learning that took place over the course of the last half-term and, once again, they were lovely occasions.

During the assemblies, we awarded the half-termly 'star' trophies to a child in each year group for the following categories: Humanities (Geography, History, Religious Education, Spanish), Writing, Reading, Maths, Science, Sport, Arts and 'The Coppice Way'. We also presented our two new trophies for Computing and Design and Technology. Both of these subjects are extremely important in the modern world and, therefore, it is very important that are reward prizes recognise this. We have many children who have a great interest or ability in these subjects so it is great that they are now part of our celebration rewards system.



Through these trophies, we recognise the many and varied talents and interests of our children and ensure that all children feel that have something to aim for. This very much fits in with our vision of wanting The Coppice Primary School to be a school where, by the time a child leaves us in Year 6, there has been 'none of their talents left undiscovered'.

We also again awarded bronze, silver and gold medals to the top three team point earners in each class. The team that earned the most team points for the last half-term was blue 'Falcons'. As you know, our School Team Point system recognises the achievements and hard work of our children on a day-to-day basis. All children earn team points across the days and weeks and these are added up across each half-term.

You can see in the tables on the following pages of this newsletter who the team point medal winners and trophy winners were and I'd like to again say a huge well done to all of the children who were given these awards on this occasion. I also want to say a big well done to all of the children for all of the team points that they earned. Every team point counts towards the total and every team point represents something that a child has achieved, which is always a cause for celebration!


Like 'M' Oscar also belongs to our Thrive Practitioner: Mrs. Small. He is two years old and is a Cockapoo.



If the answer is YES to any of these questions you need to let the office know as soon as possible.




If you have not received the email about enrolling for the new app, check your junk mail and if you still can't find it please let the office know and we can re issue your invitation to enrol.
