Choir at Shawhurst sheltered housing:

Our involvement within the local community is of the utmost importance to us. Therefore, on Tuesday of this week, our school choir went to the Shawhurst Sheltered Housing complex on Shawhurst Lane in order to sing a range of Christmas carols to the elderly residents. This is something that our choir did last year so it was fantastic to be able to do this again. The visit was greatly appreciated and enjoyed by all of the residents and the children did The Coppice proud — well done children! Sunny from Bromsgrove District Housing Association said "The Choir visit went amazing, the children from The Coppice School are a true asset to the community and the school.

The residents all loved the carol singing and were touched by the handmade Christmas cards".



The visit went so well in fact that the team, who run Shawhurst Sheltered Housing, would like us to return on a more regular basis in order for Coppice children to spend some time talking to the residents in an informal sense. It is a proven fact that older people having the opportunity to talk to the younger generation has huge mental health benefits for them. However, young people benefit hugely as well in terms of learning to understand the older generation and through developing empathy for them. Sometimes there is the view that young and old don't understand each other that well and, therefore, links like this can help break down barriers and bring benefits for everyone.

Choir at Hollywood Christian Life Centre:

Linked to the above, on Thursday, the School Choir visited The Hollywood Christian Life Centre (on Simms Lane) where they joined the congregation for their festive coffee morning (see photos below).

Whilst there, they entertained all those attending with a range of Christmas and non-Christmas songs, which went down really well and were greatly enjoyed by all. The children's conduct was described as 'impeccable' and as always, we were extremely proud of these children exhibiting 'The Coppice Way'. A big thank you goes to Pastor Steve Crosthwaite for inviting us and for taking the time to send us the the following message after the visit:
