This week, each Year 3 class had the exciting experience of exploring Lapworth Museum in the University of Birmingham. Throughout their tour, they explored each geological period, looking at the life on Earth at that time and the fossils we find from each period. They also explored the Extreme Earth Room and the mineralogy room. Following this, the children were welcomed into Lapworth's classroom by a palaeontologist who introduced them to a range of different volcanic rocks that the children were able to explore and interact with up close. They closed off their fantastic visit by building earthquake-proof houses out of Lego, that they then tested on a shaking board. A great day was had by all of the children and their conduct did the school proud! Well done to all of Year 3 - The Coppice Way in action!
