Former Coppice Pupil Takes on Incredible 1,200-Mile Challenge for Charity

We're incredibly proud to share the inspiring journey of Aidan Courts, a former Coppice pupil, classmate and friend of Miss Wells and past student of Mr Hutt. Aidan is currently walking from Land's End to John O'Groats—an astonishing 1,200-mile trek—in support of the Motor Neurone Disease Association and the Birmingham City FC Community Trust.

This challenge is deeply personal for Aidan, who is walking in memory of his beloved Grandad, who sadly passed away last year. His Grandad was by his side in 2004 when, aged just 10, Aidan walked from his home in Redditch to Coppice to raise money—an early sign of the determination and heart that continues to drive him today. Aidan is currently in Scotland and is aiming to complete his journey on 25th July—what would have been his grandad's birthday—a touching tribute to the man who inspired him. In June, Miss Wells had the pleasure of joining Aidan for a short stretch of his walk as he passed through the Midlands.

So far, Aidan has raised nearly £5,000 for his chosen charities. We wish him every success as he nears the final leg of this remarkable journey!
