Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you all had a lovely Easter break with your children and got a chance to spend some quality time together. It has been a joy to welcome the children back for the start of the Summer term and I'm full of excitement for the term ahead with events such as Sports' Days and the Summer Revel as well as other many exciting learning opportunities awaiting the children to look forward to! Uniform:

Linked to the weather, just a quick reminder, as per my newsletter before the Easter break, that children can now wear summer uniform if they wish to. 80th anniversary of VE Day celebrations next week:

Through communications from both the main school office and Year group teams, you will be aware that next week (Thursday 8th May), we will be celebrating the 80th anniversary of VE (Victory in Europe) Day along with the rest of the nation. This is a hugely significant event and we are proud, as a school to be taking part in it. All of the children (and staff) are asked to come to school wearing red, white and blue attire in order to make a clear statement of our support for this celebration.

We are asking for a £1.00 donation from every child and all money raised will go towards the Royal British Legion's charity which supports both former veterans and their families.

Please do try to ensure that you make this donation if you can as every little bit of money raised helps a huge deal and goes a long way to making a real difference! I know that your support is greatly appreciated and it is a privilege to once again be supporting the RBL.





The fantastic contribution of a new pond liner, bought by Earlswood Garage will be arriving before or around the 10th of May and Mr. Ruffles will be relaying the liner and filling the pond with water as soon as this arrives. Mrs Morgan is also keen to help us with pond plants and possibly a pump when the time comes to add some life to our pond.

Mrs Douglas and her husband: Andy have been an amazing help as we have begun to cut back some overgrown areas of the pond area whilst maintaining some hiding places and habitats for our mini beasts. During this initial work (**see pictures below**), we have seen bees, bugs, beetles, worms, woodlouse, birds and even a few newts! We have had to be very careful to keep their habitats safe and accessible which means we have stacked logs and kept some bushes, long grass and damp warm areas as they were. We have started to lay logs down to create a circular path that will be lined with a natural wood chipping path once Mr Douglas has chopped a few bigger dead trees down from our grounds.

We still have a long way to go but one thing that Parents and Carers may be able to help us with if they can, could be to donate any offcuts or old wooden railway sleepers that they no longer need so that we can create a safe border between the pond and the wild flowers that will surround it by making some raised planters. Please contact Mr. Ruffles at school if you think you may be able to help.

When reinstated, our pond will provide a wonderful area for all of the children in our school to experience the vast array of natural life that it will be home to. Exciting times indeed!


Gymnastics Star Maeva goes from strength to strength!
