
Reporting Absences

Next week will be the last week that you will be able to report an illness by text. All absences will need to be reported via the app. This is very easy to do.

Just tap on the report absence icon, which you can find on your home page or your family page and type your reason for absence and just tap the arrow to send.


The absence needs to be reported daily with a reason given. This helps us to monitor what illness are in school and which year groups are most affected.

If we do not receive a notification of absence then you will receive a message through the app in the same way as you would have received a text previously. All absences will be checked for safeguarding reasons.




Half Term Holiday Club
