You should be able to access Schoolcloud from all iPhone and Android phones, iPads and tablets, as well as laptops and desktop devices. Scroll through the dates and select the time slot that you would like.

Jack Meggitt-Phillips visit:

Years 3, 4 and 5 finished the half-term with a creative writing workshop from Jack Meggitt-Phillips, the award-winning author of the Beast and The Bethany series.

The Beast and the Bethany series has been translated into over 30 languages and has recently had a major film deal announced with Harry Potter producer, Heyday Films. The series has also won the West Sussex Children's Book Award, the Alexandra Palace Children's Book Award, the Stockport Children's Book Award, the Fantastic Book Award, the Awesome Book Award, and the Channel Island Children's Book Award.

During his workshop, which was called 'Writing with Beasts', children were given the prompts and inspiration to write and finish their own short stories. Jack's session also included puppetry, a Q&A and readings from his Beast and the Bethany series – a children's series about a young 500-year-old, a hungry beast and a rebellious prankster who's about to be eaten. Jack also spent some time signing books for children whose families had ordered them. We feel really fortunate to have had the chance to meet Jack and are hugely grateful to Jack and to our friends at Bookwagon, who organised the visit, for giving the children such an inspiring afternoon. A big thank you again goes to Mr. Laight (Assistant Headteacher and English leader) for organising another inspirational event.


