

Holiday Activities and Food Programme in Worcestershire

Free School Meal eligible children invited to sign up for the Worcestershire HAF Programme now. HAF is an optional scheme so Parents and Carers have to sign up for it to make use of it.

This can be done at the following site: https://www.haf-it.co.uk/



The instructions are:

- Parents and Carers of children eligible for means tested free school meals can create an account by signing up on the website
- After creating an account, Parents and Carers then add their children
- This data will then be verified by the County Free School Meal team and they will then issue a HAF code
- Clubs can then be booked by either:
 - Booking directly through the HAF website (in which case the code automatically transfers)
 - Booking directly with the eligible providers (in which case the HAF code will need to be given).
