Dear Parents and Carers,

As always, I hope that you've all had a good week and are looking forward to the weekend with your children and a chance to spend some quality time together.

#### **Children's Mental Health Week:**

Next week is Children's Mental Health Week and we will be marking this in school across the week through various mindfulness activities that Class Teachers will be carrying out with their children. This will include the children watching a video from the 'Lily-Jo' project that explains, in a child-friendly way, what mental health is and how children can learn to manage their own mental health in positive ways. On Friday afternoon of next week, the children will have an additional 'Feel-good' Friday afternoon. Our 'Feel-good' Friday afternoons are held every four weeks in school and are for both staff and children. This is an important component of our mental-health and wellbeing programme in school, which runs across the school year. It is also part of our 'Jigsaw' Personal and Social Education programme that some of your children may talk to you about at home.

#### **Face-to-face Parent and Carer meetings with teachers:**

Just to give you all plenty of notice that our next set of face-to-face Parent/Carer meetings with Class Teachers will be:

Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> March: 1.30 pm to 6.00 pm (Early Years and Key Stage 1)

3.30 pm to 7.00 pm (Key Stage 2)

Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> March: 3.30 pm to 7.00 pm (Early Years and Key Stage 1)

1.30 pm to 6.00 pm (Key Stage 2)

Please make a note of these dates and times and try to ensure that you have kept one of them free. It is vital that we teachers meet with you regarding your child in order to discuss their progress and targets for development.

My Deputy: Mrs. Ashwell, as usual, will be setting up the SchoolCloud booking system in order for you to book your appointments. Once this is ready to go live, we will communicate with you again.

### Children who return to school with a broken bone, fracture or other serious injury - IMPORTANT:

I would like to clarify the procedure to be followed for when a child returns to school with a broken bone, fracture or other serious injury. As you will all know, schools have a responsibility to look after the health and safety of the children in their care. We take that responsibility very seriously and seek to ensure that all necessary steps have been taken to minimise any risk to the child on their return.

#### The return process is therefore as follows:

When your child is ready to return to school, please ensure that you contact the school office in order to arrange a meeting with Mrs. Woodyatt who oversees children's medical conditions and health and safety with regard to these.

It is extremely important that we have this meeting as it enables us to discuss the child's return from both the parents' point of view and the school's point of view with regard to what this may need to look like. This is because every case can be different and the health advice given from professionals can also vary. Based on this discussion, and if deemed necessary, we can devise a Care Plan that is specific to your child, which outlines the necessary safety steps and measures that need to be in place.

Please note that your child will not be able to return to school until we have had this meeting and possibly a day or two afterwards as well. This is because, following the meeting and the creation of the Care Plan, we need to speak to all staff, who are likely to be in contact with your child when they are in school, in order to give them the information and answer any questions that they may have. Please understand that this slight delay in returning is only because we want to get things right.

We will also ask you to confirm in writing that you are happy for your child to return to school and to provide any specialist advice that you may have. Some Parents and Carers, if they have one, also provide a note from their doctor or specialist that states that they are happy for the child to return.

Finally, we do ask Parents and Carers to understand that we can't remove all risks and cannot give a 100% guarantee that a child won't be knocked when in school. However, as outlined above, there are many concrete things that we can put in place to mitigate the chance of this happening.

Hopefully all of the above is clear but please don't hesitate to contact Mrs. Woodyatt or the School Office if it isn't and they will be pleased to answer any questions.

## World Book Day- Thursday 2nd March

World Book Day is coming up on Thursday 2nd March. At Coppice, we love to read and so we're greatly looking forward to a day of celebrating and enjoying books. Here's what you need to know about World Book Day at Coppice:

As with previous years, we will not be asking for children to dress up as characters for World Book Day. We want the day to be a celebration of books rather than costumes. Instead, we invite children to come to school on the 2nd in 'cosy clothes' (e.g. pyjamas and dressing gowns) and to bring a favourite book with them to share with their friends. They can also bring slippers, a cushion and/or a teddy. This is to ensure that part of the day can be used for cosy reading for pleasure.

If children don't want to come in their pyjamas/dressing gown, they can choose to come in their school uniform. If the children do come to school wearing their cosy clothes, it is important that you ensure that they have a coat and appropriate footwear for break and lunch times.

There will be no charge for this non-uniform day: we warmly encourage parents and carers, if they're able to, to spend any money that would've previously bought costumes on books for their children. We'll be sending the £1 World Book Day vouchers home with the children as always. These can be exchanged for any of the World Book Day books or used to get a discount of £1 off any book that costs £2.99 or more. Independent bookshop *How Brave is the Wren* will be setting up a pop-up bookshop at The Hub where you can use these vouchers -- more information about this to follow soon.

Lastly, if you're feeling creative, we invite you to participate in our 'book plate' competition. We will be giving children a paper plate, which they can choose to transform into a character from a book or a scene from a book, which we will then display in our library.
