

# The Coppice Whole School Newsletter Friday 4th February 2022

Dear Parents and Carers.

I hope that you've all had a good week and are looking forward to the weekend with your children. I don't know about you but this week seems to have flown by in the blink of an eye and it's certainly been another busy week of teaching, learning and enrichment here at The Coppice.

#### King Edward's maths challenge fantastic news:

As I mentioned on last week's newsletter, four of our Year 5 pupils attended the maths challenge at King Edward's Grammar School last Friday afternoon, where they competed against a number of other schools in what is always a very high standard of competition. I am therefore absolutely delighted to tell you all that our team claimed second place meaning they received the silver medal – an amazing achievement!! We are so proud of the way that these children represented our school. Please see below a photo montage of the afternoon plus a report from Ben in 5F.

#### Report by Ben (5F):

'On Friday the 28th of January, Jack (5W), Amber (5BG), Megan and I (5F) went to a Maths Competition at King Edwards School for Boys with Mrs Giles and Mr. Mace. There were two challenges: a number crossword and a relay.

The number crossword, which we did together, was fun but very hard. The girls did the across clues and the boys did the down clues. After we found an answer, we checked it with the other pair before putting it on the final answer sheet. We scored 50/51. Wow! ;-)



In the relay, we were in pairs - the girls and the boys. The girls did the first question and, when they got the answer, they gave it to the marking teacher (a different school's teacher). If it was wrong, they had another go but that would be their last go at it. If they got it correct, they would get a different question to give to the other pair who then did that question before checking it with the marking teacher. This repeated until we ran out of time. This was tiring but very exciting!

After the challenges, we had a biscuit whilst we waited for the results...WE CAME SECOND!

We each got a silver medal, a certificate and a pencil. We also qualified for the GRAND FINAL which will take place on the 22nd of June. We are all extremely proud of each other and are looking forward to it!'

#### Science Day and appeal for help:

Last week, I also mentioned the Science Day that we will be having on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> February and asked whether any parents or carers, who work in science-based professions, could maybe spare some time to come into school in order to talk to the children about their jobs and what they entail. We have had a few offers already, which is fantastic, but we would still like there to be more in order to make the day as special for the children as possible. Some of the jobs we would love to have represented are: doctors, nurses, vets, veterinary nurses, dentists, dental nurses, midwives, physiotherapists, chemists, science teachers etc. This list is not exhaustive!

Our plan is to set the different guests up in in one of our school halls and allow the children to rotate around asking questions and being given information about each of the jobs. It will be very much like a careers fair type set-up.

Therefore, if you think that you may be able to help in any way on the day itself, even if it's for only a few hours, please email the school office with your availability. Mrs. Tomkinson (Science Leader in school) and I will be delighted to hear from you. In addition, if you know of any ex-pupils or friends/relatives, who work in the field of science and who may like to be involved, this offer is also open to them too so just ask them to get in touch.

#### Food bank donations - thank you so much:

On behalf of the school and The Coppice PTA, I just want to thank you all for the generous donations of food on Tuesday. As you know, we held a non-uniform day and asked that the children to bring a food item in to enable them to wear their own clothes. As always, our Coppice families rose to the occasion and we collected a huge amount of food that was then divided between The Hollywood Christian Life Centre food bank and the Northfield Community Partnership Foodbank. Pastor Steve Crosthwaite from Hollywood Christian Life Centre collected the donations and was bowled over by our community's generosity.

Pastor Crosthwaite sent a really lovely video message of thanks to the children where he explained what would be done with the food collected and why, and also told the children a really entertaining version of the 'Feeding of the five thousand' bible story. It was really great for the children to receive this message and we are really grateful to Pastor Crosthwaite for taking the time to put it together.

Once again, this event showed just how committed we are here at The Coppice to helping the local community and to teaching our children the vital importance of empathy and helping others.

That just leaves me to wish you all a lovely weekend. As always, we greatly look forward to welcoming the children bright and early on Monday morning.



## Chickenpox

Public Health England have now been informed that several children who attend The Coppice school have been diagnosed with suspected chicken pox. This their message to you.

Chickenpox is usually a mild illness and children usually get better by themselves. Children with chickenpox should stay off school for at least five days from onset of rash and until all the lesions have crusted over.

Children who have had chickenpox recently may develop complications if they also catch scarlet fever. Parents should remain vigilant for symptoms in children who have had chickenpox such as:

- a persistent high fever
- the skin around chickenpox blisters becoming red, hot or painful (signs of infection)
- joint pain and swelling
- your child's symptoms not improving or getting worse.

If you are concerned about the symptoms above, please seek medical assistance promptly. If your child has an underlying condition which affects their immune system, you should contact your GP or hospital doctor to discuss whether any additional measures are needed.
