

The Coppice Whole School Newsletter Friday 4th November 2022

Dear Parents and Carers.

I hope that you have all had a good first week back after the half-term break and are very much looking forward to the weekend with your children.

Ofsted Report:

I have had a few parents asking me when our Ofsted report will be released to Parents and Carers. I appreciate that it can be frustrating waiting to be able to read the finalised report and I thank you for your patience with this. However, there is a reason for the wait which I'll explain now. As you all know, we were inspected on Tuesday 4th October and Wednesday 5th October. From the end of the inspection, Ofsted have eighteen working days to release the draft report to us. Thankfully, we received the draft report at the start of this week. As a school, we then have five working days to read it and to make any comments regarding it to Ofsted. Having read the draft report, there were a couple of things that I wanted to comment on and my comments were sent back yesterday. Ofsted then have five further working days to respond to these comments. This therefore means that we should have heard back by Wednesday of next week (9th November). Once I have heard back, the report should be ready to be released. I am therefore hopeful of being able to do this on Friday 11th November.

Celebration assemblies:

On Monday and Tuesday of next week, we will be holding our Celebration Assemblies for Years 1-6 where we will celebrate all of the excellent learning that took place over the first half-term of this academic year. As always, both my Deputy, Mrs. Ashwell, and I are very much looking forward to these occasions.

During the Celebration Assemblies at the beginning of each half-term, we award bronze, silver and gold medals (pictured below) to the top three team point earners in each class. The team that earns the most team points wins the team point trophy for that half-term. To remind you all, our School Team Point system greatly values and recognises the achievements and hard work of our children on a day-to-day basis. All children earn team points across the days and weeks and these are added up across each half-term. Every team point counts towards the total and every team point represents something that a child has achieved, which is always a cause for celebration!

In addition to the above, we will again be awarding our half-termly 'star' trophies to a child in each year group for the following categories: humanities (geography, history, religious education), Spanish, writing, maths, science, sport, arts and 'The Coppice Way'. Through these trophies, we can recognise the many and varied talents of our children and ensure that all children feel that have something to aim for. This very much fits in with our vision of wanting The Coppice Primary School to be a school where, by the time a child leaves us in Year 6, there has been 'none of their talents left undiscovered'.



As you will see from the photo above, we have decided to purchase some fabulous new trophies for these awards. The difference between this academic year and the last one is that these trophies will now be kept in school. Unfortunately, the previous system of individual trophies being taken home was not working as well as we would have liked, with a number of the trophies getting damaged or broken and some not being returned. We couldn't keep replacing these and therefore we decided on a different way of doing things. What will happen now is that the six winners of each category of trophy (one child from each of the Years 1-6) will have their picture taken with the trophy. This photo will then be displayed in a public place in school for all to see. An individual photo of trophy winners will also be taken and sent home to Parents and Carers and the children's names will be published in this newsletter. We can't wait to see who the first recipients of these trophies will be!

Early Years' Celebration certificates:

On Wednesday of this week, Mrs. Ashwell and I had the pleasure of presenting celebration certificates to four children from each of the Reception classes. These were lovely occasions and it was a pleasure to hear the many fantastic reasons for why the children had received these certificates. Reasons ranged from 'Always following The Coppice Way', 'Always being kind to their friends', 'Being curious and asking lots of questions', 'Being resilient with learning their sounds' and 'Always listening their best'. The children were thrilled to receive their certificates and their happiness and pride at their achievements was a joy to behold. Once again though, I was thrilled by how happy the children, who didn't receive certificates on this occasion, were for their classmates who did. We talk a lot to the children about being pleased for others when they achieve something so to see it so clearly was great.

Mrs. Ashwell and I will be presenting celebration certificates in Nursery next week and we can't wait!

In-person Parent Meetings for Nursery through to Year 6 Parents and Carers:

Just a reminder that we will be holding Parent and Carer meetings to discuss your child's progress so far this academic year on Wednesday 16th November and Wednesday 23rd November. These are extremely important meetings and we would like every parent and carer to make an appointment with their child's teacher. By doing this, it means that school and home can work closely in partnership to ensure that your child is fulfilling their potential. We are really looking forward to seeing you all.

Appointments are already being booked using our Schoolcloud system and you will already have received information about this from our school office on Wednesday 2nd November 2022. To log in, you will need to enter your own name, your email and your child's name. Please check the spelling of all of these as they must match what we have on our records.

You should be able to access Schoolcloud from all iPhone and Android phones, iPads and tablets, as well as laptops and desktop devices. Scroll through the dates and select the time slot that you would like. If you have difficulties making an appointment please contact either the school office or your child's class teacher, who will be able to help.

That just leaves me to wish you an enjoyable weekend – hopefully there won't be too much rain! As always, we look forward to seeing all of the children on Monday morning.
