Dear Parents and Carers,

A huge welcome back to all of you after the Christmas break! I hope that all of you managed to have an enjoyable time with your children, family and friends. Obviously, if you or anyone in your family were unfortunately affected by illness, and I know that some of you were, I sincerely hope that you are on the mend and will be back to full health soon.

We are looking forward with great excitement to the new term and hopefully your children have come home feeling positive about the way that school has started for them. From my walks around school over the last couple of days, the children have settled really well back into 'The Coppice Way' routines and expectations, are working hard on their learning and, most importantly, are happy to be back.

Celebration assemblies:

We ended this first week back with our Celebration Assembles for Years 1-6 where we celebrated all of the excellent learning that took place over the course of the last half-term and, once again, they were lovely occasions. During the assemblies we again awarded bronze, silver and gold medals to the top three team point earners in each class. The team that earnt the most team points for the last half-term was 'Owls' and they were presented with the team point trophy. As you know, our School Team Point system recognises the achievements and hard work of our children on a day-to-day basis. All children earn team points across the days and weeks and these are added up across each half-term.

In addition to the above, we also awarded the half-termly 'star' trophies to a child in each year group for the following categories: Humanities (Geography, History, Religious Education), Spanish, Writing, Maths, Science, Sport, Arts and 'The Coppice Way'.

Through these trophies we recognise the many and varied talents and interests of our children and ensure that all children feel that have something to aim for. This very much fits in with our vision of wanting The Coppice Primary School to be a school where, by the time a child leaves us in Year 6, there has been 'none of their talents left undiscovered'.

You can see in the tables on Page 4 of this newsletter who the team point medal winners and trophy winners were and I'd like to again say a huge well done to all of the children who were given these awards on this occasion. I also want to say a big well done to all of the children for all of the team points that they earned. Every team point counts towards the total and every team point represents something that a child has achieved, which is always a cause for celebration!

Nasal Flu Vaccinations - New Date

You may recall that all children from Reception to Year 6 were offered nasal flu vaccinations during the last term. Many of you told us that you missed out on the opportunity for your child to receive this vaccination and had had trouble getting it at your local surgery.

Vaccination UK has been in contact with us and offered us another date and will be in school on Friday 27th January only, to administer vaccines to anyone who did not previously receive the vaccine and wishes to have it. Please complete the form via the link below and give your consent for this. Please be aware this process is managed completely by the NHS team so the only way to give consent is via the link.

Your child will not receive the vaccine if you have not given consent via this form. It is very important that you do NOT complete the form if your child has already had the vaccine earlier last term, or over the Christmas period.

Allergy Menus - How to Book Meals on ParentPay


If your child has a food allergy or intolerance and you have a paper menu in place, AiP have now included an option to reflect this on ParentPay.

This option is called "Please choose this option if your child has an allergy or intolerance". Select this option and this will enable you to book your meal but the meal provided will be as you have chosen on the paper menu. If you accidentally choose a different option, please do not worry as your child will be given the food you have chosen on your paper allergy menu regardless of the ParentPay selection.

If your child has a food allergy or intolerance but you have not yet returned your paper menu your child will receive the AiP allergy safe menu until your paper menu is returned.


If you have any queries please come to the school office and we can pass any specific requests on to AiP.
