Well done Gymnasts – you're amazing!



Science fair - exciting news!

We are excited to announce that our Coppice Science Fair is back for 2023 and will take place during the week beginning 27th March. This will be an inspiring week for the children and will be packed full of science-based assemblies, learning and stories as well as an inspirational online science talk from Colin for Years 1-6.

The week's events have been organised by our Year 1 and Science Leader: Mrs. Tomkinson, in conjunction with Miss. Dixon (Year 1 teacher) and Miss. Cox (Year 6 teacher) and I'd like to thank them all of their hard work in putting the week together. I know the children will greatly enjoy it!

In advance of the week itself, we are again running a science project competition for which Mrs. Tomkinson has put together the following information if your child would like to take part:

There will be prizes for each of the categories: EYFS (Nursery & Reception), Years 1 & 2, Years 3 & 4, Years 5 & 6 and a whole school winner!

It's back!


The Coppice Primary Science Fair 2023



We are excited to announce our Coppice Science Fair is back for 2023! There will be prizes for each year group category and a whole school winner!

There will be an EYFS /Year 1 \$ 2 / Year 3 \$4 and Year 5 \$6 category.

The project can be an age appropriate experiment to answer a question or a problem, along with a solution, or it could be a research project. It can be <u>on any area of science that</u> interests <u>your child</u>, for example 'How many stars can we see?', 'How does a hovercraft work?' or 'What would life be like if I spent a month in the international space station?', 'What happens when I mix....and...... or researching a significant scientist who has made a difference to our everyday lives.



When your child has carried out their investigation or research they have to make a display board to communicate their learning to others. This can be made from a large cardboard box opened out and then painted or covered in wrapping paper and held together with tape. It needs to have three panels of information (as shown).

This display board should show the project title/question/problem, what your child thinks the answer is, what they did to investigate their question, what they found and a conclusion. If they wish, they may also include a

small model, experiment and/or project They must have names / class / year group clearly visible.

All projects need to be in school by Monday 20th March and our School Science Fair will take place during the week of 27th March. A panel of judges will help to choose the best projects.
