Dear Parents and Carers,

As always, I hope that you have all had a good week and are very much looking forward to the weekend.

Kindness assemblies and examples of kindness:

This week our assemblies have centred around the value of 'kindness'. As I always say to the children at every opportunity, kindness is the value that I place above all others and is the one that I would give to everyone if I had the power to do so. We have talked about how kindness is the quality of being friendly, generous and considerate and that it is the 'little acts of kindness' that truly matter. I have seen and experienced some wonderful examples of kindness from the children this week. For example, I lost count of how many adults and children asked me on the gate how I was on Monday and if I was feeling better, following being off ill last week. This really gave me a lift and certainly helped my recovery! Also, on the gate, and not for the first time, I witnessed the kindness of children towards other children, who were having a bit of a wobble coming in. I saw children putting their arm around their friend or holding their hand down the path, which made such a difference and encouraged their friend to carry on their journey into school. Finally, I was out on the playground during the Reception and Year 5 'buddy' playtime on Tuesday morning and was completely bowled over by the kindness that our Year 5 children showed towards their buddies. They taught them traditional games e.g. 'What's the time Mr. Wolf?' and played the games alongside them, they supported and encouraged them on the Adventure Zone equipment and sat and chatted to them about their interests. To see the smiles on all of the children's faces was a joy to behold and showed me how much our children are filled with inherent kindness towards others. What a difference this quality makes to our world – the little things matter!

Year 3 Stone Age trip:

Year 3 had a very exciting day on Monday when they went on their Stone Age Explorers trip to The Frank Chapman Centre as part of their 'What was life like in prehistoric Britain?'. The children took part in a shelter building competition, made weapons and tools and then practised their throwing skills by hunting (wooden) boars. They also learnt how to light a fire! The children absolutely loved the hands-on aspect of this trip and, despite the cold, they threw themselves into every aspect of it. The children's 'Coppice Way' behaviour and conduct were praised greatly by The Frank Chapman staff which made us all very proud! Well done children!


