Links with Woodrush

As you all know, we are next door neighbours to The Woodrush High School and are the main feeder school for them, with the overwhelming majority of our pupils transferring to them at the end of Year 6. Since becoming Head, it has been extremely important to me that we build strong links between the schools that are in the best interests of our pupils and community. Thankfully, Woodrush have appointed a new Headteacher who feels exactly the same as I do: Mr. Barber. We had begun talking prior to his appointment and both felt that there were many exciting possibilities for future collaboration between the two schools. We had our first meeting, since his appointment, on Tuesday of this week and discussed a number of topics such as ensuring high quality transition for our Year 6 pupils, car parking and pupil safety and aspects of teaching and learning. Both schools look forward greatly to cooperating together and, as Heads, we will be having monthly meetings from now on. We have also agreed that our Assistant Head: Mr. Laight will sit on Woodrush's Board of Trustees which mirrors Mr. Monk (Woodrush Deputy Head) who already sits on our Board of Trustees. Again, this strengthen ties between the schools.

On Monday, Year 6 had the amazing opportunity to take part in a Robotics Workshop led by an expert from Education called Jack . The children worked in pairs to build and program a robot (using Lego Spike Prime Coding Language) and program it to move accurately around a track. The children needed to build upon their previous computing skills to create coding algorithms to drive the motors and make the wheels travel and turn by the correct amount. A lot of resilience and trial and error was needed and all the children were really successful. Jack and all the Copper Staff were full of praise and admiration for how well the children tackled the challenge and for their exemplary attitude and engagement.

Science Week 14th- 18th March

We are celebrating National Science Week on Wednesday 16th March. All classes will have science activities all day. There will be visits from real scientists - a surveyor, a doctor, a beekeeper, a soil scientist, a pharmacist, a dad working in forensic science, a speech and language therapist and hopefully more.

There will be science stories and a "Guess The Scientist" activity which your child can participate in.

Children (on science day) can bring in a bag / box of items that link them to a significant scientist / or science based job. Teachers will then give them some time to share them with their class. There will be lots of team points awarded throughout the day.

Example:

I am bringing in items as my significant scientist

The Person is...Mary Anninng.

So I am bringing in a 'fossil' / a dinosaur / a map of the Jurassic coast / a book about dinosaurs / a palaeontology brush / a picture of her / the rhyme she shells sea shell etc...


Don't forget to enter our Science Fair before 25th March!


We are excited to announce our Coppice Science Fair is back for 2022! There will be prizes for each category: • EYFS (Nursery & Reception) • Years 1 & 2 • Years 3 & 4 • Years 5 & 6 • A whole school winner!

The project can be an age appropriate experiment to answer a question or a problem, along with a solution, or it could be a research project. It can be on any area of science that interests your child, for example 'How many stars can we see?', 'How does a hovercraft work?' or 'What would life be like if I spent a month in the international space station?', 'What happens when I mix.....and....... etc. Alternatively, the project could be researching a significant scientist who has made a difference to our everyday lives.

When your child has carried out their investigation or research, they then have to make a display board to communicate their learning to others. This can be made from a large cardboard box opened out and then painted or covered in wrapping paper and held together with tape. It needs to have three panels of information (as shown). This display board should show the project title/question/problem, what your child thinks the answer is, what they did to investigate their question, what they found out and a conclusion. If they wish, they may also include a small model or experiment with their project. They must have name, class and year group clearly visible.

All projects need to be in school by Friday 25th March. Our School Science Fair will take place during the week of 28th March and a panel of judges will help to choose the best projects. We can't wait to see your projects
