Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you all had a lovely half-term holiday week with your children and got chance to enjoy the beautiful weather that we are currently having – long may it continue! It has been a joy to see the children coming into school with big smiles on their faces and to hear and see the children playing happily on the school field again – what summer is all about!

With regards to my previous newsletter communications, I now want to confirm that the current arrangements for both pick-up and drop-off will definitely continue until the end of the school year, even if the 21st June ending of restrictions happens. This also means that we won't be having parents or carers coming into school beyond the school gates before September. The current situation in wider society is something that we don't want to take risks with and, as I've said before, the last thing that anyone wants in the final weeks of the year is a bubble closure. Also, all of you are completely familiar with the current arrangements and I feel that further change now, for just a few weeks, could lead to issues or confusion for you as parents and carers, which again we want to avoid. Obviously we are hoping to have a smooth end to the school year, all being well, and I know that I will have your support with this decision.

On a completely different subject, this coming Monday, we will be sharing with you an online parent questionnaire in order that we can get your views about the school. We would really appreciate it if as many of you as possible complete this as your opinions about our school are greatly valued. As a School Leadership Team, we are always looking to areas where we can improve further and this feedback is therefore a key component of this process. You will be notified by text when the questionnaire has gone live. Thank you in advance for taking the time to fill in this questionnaire.

One of the most important means of communication we have are our weekly newsletters (both whole school and year group newsletters) which are full of key information for the week or term ahead. On Monday, a letter went home explaining about how these are shared with you and where you can access them. It is vital that everyone reads their relevant newsletters and are aware of what is going on in school and within their child's year group. From now on, at the end of every newsletter, there will be a link to click to take you directly to the year group newsletters.

Finally, I just want to mention a fabulous and important initiative that is going on in the local area. This was brought to my attention by one of our parents: Mrs. Rawlings. A local group called 'Rubbish Friends' are currently meeting monthly to collect litter in the Wythall/Hollywood area and would welcome any new recruits who come accompanied with their parents. The next organised meeting is on Saturday 10th July at 10.00am and the group are meeting outside the White Swan, Alcester Road, Wythall.

ABSENCE REQUEST FORMS

Just a reminder to all parents (including Nursery) of our absence procedure if you wish to take your child out of school during term time.

We have an absence request form which must to be completed by anyone wishing to take their child out of school. This is necessary for any scheduled absence of one day or longer.

School can not give authorisation to any holiday taken within the school term times except in exceptional circumstances. Unauthorised holiday will be recorded on the register as a 'G' mark.

Absence for funerals would be shown as a 'C' on the register and absence for religious observance e.g. Eid will be recorded as an 'R' mark on the register. These will be authorised absences.

Art Resources Appeal (Again)!


We had an excellent response to our recent appeals for art resources - thank you so much to everyone who sent in donations of wallpaper and sheets!
