Head Teacher's News

Reading - so important! Please support your child.

If we had to pick out one thing that makes a significant difference to children's learning and life-chances, it is the ability to read well.

Despite our efforts to teach reading well in school (e.g. finding more lesson time for it, training staff, strongly focusing on 'early reading', investing in Rapid Reading and Renaissance Reading, renewing class libraries, ensuring quality class readers etc.) we are finding more and more children are not engaging in reading regularly at home.

Reading is a key, basic skill that needs to be regularly practised. This should take place ideally most days of the week for at least ten or fifteen minutes (not a huge time commitment), overseen by an adult.

We appreciate that life is busy for many families but even a short time regularly supporting children's reading in this way makes a huge difference (despite the long hours I work I have always found time to do this with my own children).

In school we simply do not have the capacity to do this so are reliant on parental support from home. Looking at our data in school, there is a direct correlation between children who are not progressing in reading, with nonengagement and lack of practise at home (with 'fluency' in reading being a particular problem with these children).

In many end of year reports, where there is a shortfall, I often prompt children to continue reading over the Summer, which would help too.

Research suggests that boys respond well to e-books, so kindles might be the way forward (available for £30 at the moment, on offer). Also, we have a fantastic library in Hollywood that is keen to engage with families.

We appreciate that many of our parents do support in this way, diligently (thank you). It would help ensure the futures of all of our children if they had this level of support. So please help.
