

# The Coppice Whole School Newsletter Friday 11th November 2022

Dear Parents and Carers,

As always, I hope that you have all had a good week and are very much looking forward to the weekend with your children. Again, there is much to share with you all after another busy and enjoyable week in school.

#### Ofsted report - finally!

After what has seemed like an eternal wait, we have now received the final version of our Ofsted report from the inspection back in early October. Shortly after receiving this newsletter, you will all receive a copy of the report by email. I have to say that I am delighted with the overall judgement and the comments that were made about our school, which I believe reflect the hard work and passion of all of the staff here at The Coppice and by 'all' I mean everyone and not just the teaching staff. As a Head, I am extremely lucky to have such a fabulous team of people working here. I certainly feel that the many strengths of our school have been recognised in the report and that these come through very clearly. As is stated in the report, and as we do every day already, we will continue to relentlessly work on improving the school even further over the coming years and months and won't ever rest on our laurels. We want the very best for your children and this will always be our aim. A huge thank you also goes to each and every Parent and Carer who support the school and its children every day and for the many glowing comments that you all gave us as part of the inspection.

#### **Remembrance:**

As you will all know, today is Remembrance Day and this will be followed by Remembrance Sunday over the weekend. As a school, we always believe it is vital to make all of our children aware of the importance of this event and feel it is our duty to ensure that the sacrifices that our service men and women have made throughout history and into the present day are forever remembered and fully understood. We also have a number of children in our school, who are sons and daughters of service people, and it is vital that these children see how much the school values the contributions of their parents.

Today, our assemblies have all been about Remembrance and it has been lovely to see how thoughtfully and respectfully the children have engaged with these. The key messages have focused around how lucky we all are to have our freedom in order that we can come to school and safely learn because of the selfless actions of others who have fought to ensure that this is the case. We have also been selling poppies and other poppy-related items over the last couple of weeks. All of the proceeds of these sales will of course go The British Legion in order to help support both former and current military personnel.

Today, our four service children: Jack (Year 5), George (Year 4), Ben (Year 3) and Rose (Year 1), accompanied by Mrs. Ashwell and me, attended the service at the Drake's Cross War Memorial where George laid a wreath on behalf of the school. It was an honour to be able to attend this service and the attendees from the local community were extremely impressed with our children and their conduct.





All classes in school also made a poppy wreath which we have displayed in the library and main entrance areas of school. These look absolutely beautiful and are a very poignant reminder of why we mark Remembrance Day at this time every year.





#### **Years 1-6 Celebration Certificates:**

Our Celebration Assemblies for Years 1-6 on Tuesday were wonderful occasions and, as always, my Deputy: Mrs. Ashwell and I were bowled over by the fantastic reasons given for why the children received the awards that they did. #### **Early Years' Celebration Certificates:**

Following on from presenting of celebration certificates to our Reception children last week, this week we also presented certificates to our Nursery children. It is always a joy to spend time in the company of our youngest children who are at the start of their educational journey with us. To see their growth in confidence and development over the course of just half-a-term is fabulous and shows the impact of what we do here at The Coppice. As with the Year 1-6 children, you can see the names of both the Nursery and Reception children, who won certificates, further on in this newsletter. A huge well done to all of these children as well!

#### **Energy talk Monday:**

Just a reminder that on Monday evening, L.S. Toth and Sons, a local boiler and heating engineering company, will be giving a talk about heating awareness and boiler controls, which will help people to understand their heating controls better and to use their system more efficiently, with the aim being to lower energy bills, especially during the winter months. The talk will take place between 5.30 pm and 6.30 pm in our Infant Hall. There will be a half-an-hour presentation followed by an opportunity to ask questions. This will be a drop-in event so please don't worry that you have to have signed up for it – just turn up if you would like to attend. Access and exit will be via the St. Mary's Church doors.

#### Parents and Carer meetings next week:

We are all greatly looking forward to our meetings with you all next week in order to discuss your children's progress so far this year and to discuss their targets for development with you. It is always a pleasure to welcome you all into school. #### Well done Sophia - an 'up-cycler' of the future!

Another of our children: Sophia, from Year 5, demonstrated one of her talents last weekend when she upcycled and re-designed an old skateboard. Firstly, she stripped it down to the original bare wood and then completed her redesign (see picture below). Incredibly, the artwork that she put on it was done freehand, which I think you'll agree is extremely impressive! Once she had finished the artwork, she varnished the wood to ensure that the design was preserved. Well done Sophia – a graphic designer and up-cycler of the future!





#### **Update on Cody's break dancing:**

Cody, from Year 5. has continued his breakdancing progress by competing in two 'battles' over the last few weeks. Firstly, he competed in the '2 fast' event in Nuneaton where two hundred and fifty people from all over the UK competed. The competition was of a high standard and Cody managed to qualify in the top 16, which was a great achievement. This encouraged him to compete at the next event: KBC (Kids Breaking Championships). This three-day event was held in Derbyshire, where people came from all over the world to compete. Among the competitors were Kelvin Clark from Diversity and Kid Karam, who has just qualified to represent Team GB in the 2024 Olympics. Again, the competition was fierce and Cody managed to make the top 16 in his 1v1 category and he also competed in his first 2v2 battle. Cody has a real passion for breakdancing, which is fantastic, and we can't wait to hear news of his next event and how he gets on.



#### **Daniel's Shoebox Appeal:**


