It's great to be properly back!

It has been a lovely first week of full schooling at The Coppice.

Overwhelmingly, the children seem so happy to be back. Also, overall, children have come back in a very good frame of mind, ready to work and seemingly unaffected by the oppressive impact of lockdown. It's been delightful having them back, feeling like a proper school again (though still sticking rigidly to our Covid risk assessment).

We are now starting to look ahead with optimism, wondering when our first educational visits can happen, our first PTA event, our first assembly, etc. However, we know there is still a way to go. Only a week in, and the mass return of children to school seems to have already impacted on infection rates. Accordingly, to avoid yet another school closure, we must all keep working together to reduce risk, keeping up with the precautions (this does mean continuing with social distancing at pick-up and drop-off, and wearing masks on site). We already know of one school in our partnership that has had to close a whole year group this week because of a positive case being identified. We need to try our utmost to avoid this here.

Infection rates locally (Bromsgrove/Solihull) are still marginally above the national figure, at 52 per 100,000 (though Redditch is well above, at 137 cases per 100,000, as opposed to 50 per 100,000 nationally), so we do need to continue to be cautious.

Understandably, there is some anxiety amongst parents regarding children who have missed out on significant chunks of schooling. We do have a plan. However, this plan is reliant on children getting to school promptly. Our 'catch-up' programme will rely heavily on catch-up sessions first thing in the morning (more information to come).

With everybody back, I've had some lovely comments from parents, wishing me well for my retirement from September and people seem reassured by Mr Hutt taking the reins (understandably so).
