### **Head Teacher's News**

#### Water Bottles in School

I think by now we are all are aware of the benefits of children keeping hydrated, i.e. it impacts positively on general health as well as 'brain health'. We strongly encourage children to bring water bottles to school, so much so that we sell our own bottles at the school office (see below). They are only £1.50 each and you can also purchase additional lids for just 50p. Our policy is that they should contain only water as water is the healthiest option. I appreciate that some children are reluctant to drink just water, in which case, it's important to 'educate'. The problem with squash and the like is that it creates a 'grey area', which could lead to bottles being filled with drinks that are high in sugar and E-numbers, impacting negatively on children's health, behaviour and learning. So, water only, please! Children are actively encouraged to drink from their bottles regularly, at key times during the day (e.g. just before going out to break, end of lessons etc.). We do not allow children to keep water bottles to hand on, or by desks throughout the lesson. This is because it creates clutter and some children use them as 'soothers' and get distracted. Also, allowing them the opportunity to drink constantly throughout the day leads to more trips to the toilets during lesson time! Within each classroom, teachers organise a holding area for bottles.

Obviously, where there's a proven medical need (supported by a doctor's note) children will be allowed access throughout.

Thank you in anticipation of your support with this policy.

## **Coming up at The Coppice**



## Science Fair 2020

We are excited to be taking part in this year's Primary Science Fair. There will be a whole school competition and then an inter school final with 5 other schools. There is a Reception /Year 1 &2 / Year 3&4 and Year 5&6 category.

The project can be an age appropriate experiment to answer a question or a problem, along with a solution, or it could be a research project. It can be on any area of science that interests your child, for example 'How many stars can we see?', 'How does a hovercraft work?' or 'What would my family eat on the ISS if we were with Tim Peake?', 'What happens when I mix.....and......?



When your child has carried out their investigation or research they have to make a display board to communicate their learning to others. This can be made from a large cardboard box opened out and then painted or covered in wrapping paper and held together with tape. It needs to have three panels of information (as shown).

This display board should show the project title/question/problem, what your child thinks the answer is, what they did to investigate their question, what they found and a conclusion. If they wish, they may also include a small model, experiment and/or project notes.

All projects need to be in school by Friday 20th March and our School Science Fair will

take place during the week of 23<sup>rd</sup> March. A panel of judges will help to choose the best projects to represent the school at the Regional Primary Science Fair to be held on Wednesday 1st April.

## Mr Edwards' sports report

On Thursday 5th March the Year 6 netball teams (plus Keeva from Year 5) visited Beaconside Primary for their regular fixture.

Each time we play them the standard is improving- it's clear that our opponents are working hard to gain a victory against us. We split into our usual two groups (Reds and Blues), the Reds (Jack PB, Penny, Nicole, Molly, Leo and Joe) on the top pitch. The Blues (Keeva, Leila, Han, Eloise, Florence, Billy and Emily) on the lower pitch.
