### **Mental Health Awareness Week 2022:**

With it being Mental Health Awareness Week, we talked to the children in our assemblies on Monday about how we can become both physically and mentally fit and how the combination of these two factors makes happy human beings. Over the next couple of weeks, we will be creating a mental health and wellbeing tab on our website, which will contain a number of useful resources and links. The mental wellbeing of our children and community is of utmost importance to us and we therefore hope that the resources that we provide will help to achieve this aim in addition to what we already do in school.

#### Online safety reminder and resources:

Linked to resources being put on our website, we have now created an online safety section on our school website, which can be found under the 'Parent Resources' tab, that contains a number of parental guides for online platforms such as Whatsapp, Instagram and Tik-tok. The purpose of providing this information is to help all parents and carers navigate and understand the online minefield that your child could become exposed to. The factsheets make clear the age-limits of these platforms, explain what they do and what the dangers are. They also explain how you can view your child's activity, how to set parental controls to limit their use of them as well as information on how to report concerns.

#### September 2022 School Transport Applications

A reminder to all Y6 school leavers that they need to complete a new application if they require transport assistance to their new school in September.

This will be assessed under Worcestershire County Council's Home to School Transport Policy and applications should be made via the Council's website: <a href="https://www.worcestershire.gov.uk/SchoolTransportApplication">www.worcestershire.gov.uk/SchoolTransportApplication</a>.

It is important that an application is made online as soon as possible, or at least before 31<sup>st</sup> July, to ensure that the request can be assessed and any pass issued in time for the start of the new academic year.

Late applications (submitted after 31<sup>st</sup> July) will still be accepted but MAY NOT be assessed in time for the start of the new academic year.

IF A TRANSPORT APPLICATION HAS ALREADY BEEN SUBMITTED FOR SEPTEMBER THERE IS NO NEED TO DO SO AGAIN AND WE WILL ADVISE YOU OF THE OUTCOME OVER THE COMING MONTHS. Alternatively, you can view any progress via the Application Tracker (<a href="https://www.worcestershire.gov.uk/ApplicationTracker">www.worcestershire.gov.uk/ApplicationTracker</a>), using the EDT Reference Number provided when you submitted the application.
