

The Coppice Whole School Newsletter Friday 14th January 2022

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you've all had a good week and are looking forward to a couple of well-deserved days at home with your children over the weekend.

It's been a fabulous, first full week back in school and the children have coped with this really well. As we know as adults, it's never easy completing the first full week of work after the Christmas break so the fact that the children have eased back into routines and expectations so well, is a credit to them. I'd also like to say that a lot was written in the press about how much the pandemic has damaged children irreparably. However, this is not our experience and I can honestly say that, without doubt, children have a great capacity to come back from adverse situations and your children are testament to that. Yes, we know that there have been blips for some children from an emotional point of view but, overall, all of the children are back in the full swing of school life and this is without a doubt a reflection of how parents and carers have supported them at home and worked in partnership with us at school.

Catch-up interventions and new members of staff:

Linked to the above, we are continuing to work very hard on ensuring that the children catch up as quickly as possible on any learning that was missed due to the partial closure of the school over the last couple of years. To support the existing staff in this aim, we have invested the funding available to us to employ two members of additional teaching staff, on temporary contracts, to deliver catch-up intervention work in the areas of phonics, reading, writing and maths over the course of the next couple of months.

Mrs. Ledgard, a former teacher at The Coppice, will be working with identified Key Stage 2 children across Years 3-6 for two days a week. Mrs. Williams will also be delivering catch-up intervention with children in Years 1 and 2. This will also be for two days a week. Finally, we have employed Mrs. Lewis for four days a week in Early Years (Nursery and Reception) to cover the two days that were previously taught by Mrs. Walters and also provide two extra days of cover for existing Nursery and Reception teachers as well as carrying out intervention work.

We are delighted with the extra capacity that we have created and the quality of the staff that we have employed to carry out these crucial roles. It was really important that I made you aware of who these new members of staff are, as some of your children may well mention them at various points in conversation at home. Obviously, I know that you will join me in warmly welcoming these new staff to The Coppice family.

Design and Technology Curriculum – help if you can!

As you will all know now from my past communications, I fully aim to ensure that this is a school 'where no talent goes undiscovered.' One of the subjects that we, as a school, are passionate about ensuring our children receive an inspiring and progressive curriculum in, is Design and Technology. This is a subject which has huge potential for unleashing the creative talents of many of our children but unfortunately, in past years, it had taken a bit of a back seat to more traditional, academic subjects. Not any more though because D and T (to give it its shortened term) is thankfully very much back on the agenda! Thanks to the hard work of our dedicated Design and Technology Leaders: Mrs. Bond and Mrs. Rowles (Year 2 teachers), we now have a D and T curriculum that goes all the way through the school which is already really engaging and enthusing the children who have experienced it.

Our curriculum has three units of D and T per year per year group (from Years 1 -6 upwards) that progressively builds and revisits the children's knowledge and skills as they move through the school. These project units are in the areas of woodwork, building and construction, pulleys and levers, wheels and axles, textiles, graphic design, pneumatics, electricity and food/nutrition. Obviously, year groups will not cover all of these areas every year but they will have covered and revisited all of them by the time that they reach Year 6

As part of the design of this curriculum, Mrs. Bond and Mrs. Rowles have audited our existing resources in school. This is so that we can ensure that we have the maximum amount of equipment possible to enable all projects to be ideally completed in pairs of children. We will also need additional adults to help support what is often a labour intensive process, as I know you'll all appreciate, and this is where you all come in!

We are fully aware that we have a number of electricians, plumbers, builders, carpenters etc amongst our parent and carer body. **Therefore, we are appealing for two things:**

-Parents and carers, who work in trades, or design and technology linked professions such as engineering, to volunteer to come in for a day or two to help support projects. We are aware that this is a big ask with work commitments but we know that the children would find it hugely inspirational to have REAL tradespeople in to help with the projects. Obviously though, this appeal doesn't preclude other parents, who aren't in trades from also volunteering.

-Parents and Carers, who work in trades, or design and technology linked professions, or anyone from the general Parent/Carer body who is able to help us in anyway with the purchase of resources that we need such as hacksaws, vices, glue guns, children-friendly wires and bulbs etc. These are just a few of what we need more of and it would be amazing if we were able to have tradespeople or other parents/carers offering to purchase some equipment for us, donating some or making a donation to the school that we could then spend on these resources for the children.

If you think that you are able to help in any way at all with the above requests, please could you contact Mrs. Bond or Mrs. Rowles via the school office as soon as possible. I can't tell you how appreciative we would all be – especially the children!

Class assemblies and other events:

I just want to let you know, as I have been asked on a few occasions now, whether class assemblies and other events e.g. music concerts will be going ahead over the course of this academic year. My answer to this is a categoric 'Yes!' It is my full intention that all children will get this opportunity, as they did in the recent class nativities at Christmas because these are events that are so important for the children from their developmental point of view. Giving children the opportunity to perform on a stage and to articulate out loud can build so much confidence in children and can literally be life-changing, defining moments. Not only that, but they also create lasting memories, a sense of togetherness and teamwork and, most importantly, a huge sense of enjoyment.

Obviously, depending on the climate at the time of your child's class assembly, we may well still need to have in place the measures that we had at the Christmas nativities in order to keep everyone safe. You will be reminded of what the measures at the time are by email from the school office in the days prior to your child's class assembly.

For information, our class assemblies resume on Friday 21st January with 5W's class assembly.

Feedback re Celebration assemblies:

Whilst talking about assemblies, I just want to thank the many parents who have made such positive comments about the Celebration Assembly awards that we are giving out every half-term. What has particularly been mentioned is the fact that we are recognising the achievements of our children across the range of subjects that we teach at primary level and hence our appreciation of the 'whole child'. As a school, it is so important that we don't just celebrate academic achievements but also those of our artists, musicians, sportspeople, designers etc.

Over the next two weeks my Deputy: Mrs. Ashwell and I will be presenting certificates in Early Years (Nursery and Reception) which is always an absolute joy. I have to say that I can't wait to recognise the achievements of our youngest children.

That just leaves me to thank you all again for your support over the last couple of weeks and to wish you all a lovely weekend. As always, we greatly look forward to welcoming the children bright and early on Monday morning.

Medical conditions/Allergies etc
