Compliments for The Coppice and staff:

On Monday, I was showing a visitor from the local authority around the school. As soon as we entered the playground, she said, 'Wow – what an incredible setting you have here!' She then proceeded to comment on how amazing she thought our school was generally which, obviously, filled me with pride. This then led to her saying that she wanted to bring groups of teachers from other schools here in the future to see the quality of science teaching and provision that we have here. High praise indeed and richly deserved from my point of view. Our science leadership here at The Coppice, led by Mrs. Tomkinson, with support from Miss. Dixon and Miss. Cox, is first rate and is a huge strength of our school. For this to be recognised by external visitors though is always a fantastic feeling.

Trips next week:

Linking into the previous point, next week is an exciting week in terms of trips for three of our year groups with Year 1 going to Sandwell Valley on Tuesday (1B and half of 1T) and Wednesday (1D and the other half of 1T) as part of their science learning on plants and seasons; Year 2 are going to The Botanical gardens on Tuesday as part of their science learning on plants, which builds on their learning in Year 1; and Year 6 are visiting The Big Bang Fair at the NEC on Wednesday (6RC and half of 6LC) and Thursday (6W and half of 6LC) as a culmination to all of the science learning that they have completed during their time at The Coppice. All of these trips will be greatly enjoyed by the children and are a great complement to the science learning that the children will have done in class, which gives them an opportunity to apply and reinforce their learning in real-life contexts. These trips are another reason why our science learning is so strong here.

National Music Day and Thank a Teacher Day:

Next Wednesday (21st June) is "National Thank a Teacher Day" and also "National Music Day". We will be marking these events with special assemblies on Wednesday afternoon (Years 3-6) and on Thursday (Reception and Years 1 and 2). Even though the day is called 'Thank a Teacher Day', we will be celebrating all of our school staff: Teachers, Teaching Assistants, Special Support Assistants, Lunchtime staff, kitchen staff, office staff and site staff for the fantastic job that they all do in service of your children every day. I will be talking to the children about how they wouldn't have such a wonderful school to come to if it wasn't for all of these people working so hard and so closely together. All of these staff are 'educators' in different ways and your children benefit from every single one of them for a whole variety of reasons. Therefore, it is right and proper that we mark this day and show our gratitude to our wonderful team here at The Coppice!

In the assemblies, because it is World Music Day as well, we will have performances from both our choir and gymnasts and children will be singing songs that they have learnt. As always, we know that these will be lovely events and I look forward to sharing some photos of them next week.

Nursery and Reception Celebration certificates:

Twice this week, Mrs. Ashwell and I have had the pleasure of presenting celebration certificates to our Nursery children. These are always joyous occasions and I absolutely love seeing the looks on the faces of the children when they hear their names read out and they get to come to the front to collect their certificates. The looks of pride, combined with a touch of astonishment, are priceless! A huge well done to all of the children who received a certificate on this occasion.

Next week, we will have the pleasure of presenting certificates to our Reception children and Mrs. Ashwell and I are already greatly looking forward to when we do this.

Debating Success:

Last Friday (9th June), two Year 6 children: Seth and Megan (both 6W) represented The Coppice in the second round of the Primary Debating Competition held at King Edward's Boys' School. This was the follow-on round to the one that I reported on a few weeks ago. Once again, these two children did incredibly well and we received the following feedback from Amy Bishop (Partnership Manager) at King Edward's:

'Thank you so much for sending such talented young debaters to us on last Friday! Our senior students wanted to share the following feedback with your fantastic debaters:

Thank you for attending our debating session this afternoon - both of your debates were phenomenal and flowed well! You should be proud of yourselves! We loved your examples and context to support your answers as well as your fluency and supporting knowledge.

First of all, Megan achieved full marks in our scoring. She had a very clear speech with great clarity in outlining what she was going to talk about, and her organisation. She was able to confidently and effectively answer every POI (point of interest) while also putting forward great POIs for the opposition. Her statistics and research were incredibly thorough, thus strengthening her speech with great examples. She also effectively used emotive techniques to achieve this. Overall it was an incredible speech in which she was able to demonstrate great debating skills.

Seth was also a great debater today! He had incredible responses to his POIs and rebuttals, and he also successfully gave thought-provoking POIs to the other team. His organisation was very thorough, which increased his clarity and his specific information enhanced his argument. Overall his tone was also clear and great eye contact was held throughout. He also achieved a great mark- only one mark lost.'

Unfortunately, our two debaters, despite their incredible performances, were just pipped to the post in getting into the Grand Final when the results came in. Nevertheless, as they were so amazing, they have been asked to be part of the floor on finals day where they can compete for the prize of best floor debater. This is where Seth and Megan can showcase all of their skills rather than competing in part of the debate themselves. As you might expect, we are incredibly proud of these two children and they are a credit to The Coppice. Yet again, this is an example of how we give our children many varied opportunities to show off their talents and abilities. Well done Megan and Seth!






