Dear Parents and Carers,

As always, I hope that you have all had a good week and are very much looking forward to the weekend with your children. As with last week, we've had another great week in school and there is again much to tell you all.

Coppice Summer Revel – an amazing success!

Our Coppice Summer Revel last week was a huge success and I know that those of you who attended will agree with that. We were blessed with the most beautiful of evenings and there was an absolutely fantastic atmosphere. It was fabulous to stand at my vantage point in the announcing area and watch families having a lovely time together (**see photo montage later in this newsletter**). For some of our families, this was the first Revel that they'd experienced and we had many compliments about how lovely the event was. My family loved it too and it was a great feeling to have them with me. My daughter Eliza loved playing with Coppice children and they made her feel very welcome – what amazing children we have here at The Coppice!

I want to thank everyone who came and spent their hard-earned money and, obviously, our fantastic PTA for their tireless efforts over the course of this year in organising the event. We truly have a fabulous and dedicated PTA and are very lucky – not every school does! Through everyone's efforts, we raised an incredible amount of money that will go towards the playground developments that you know have already begun. We are still finalising the overall total but we know for certain that we have considerably exceeded last year's £5000-00! Thank you so much everyone!

Year 6 SAT results – well done children!

We received our Year 6 SAT results this week and are thrilled with how our children performed. These are the statutory tests that all Year 6 children are required to undertake. After the children completed them in May, they were then sent away to be externally and independently marked. This is the same process for all schools across the country.

The figures in bold below are The Coppice figures and the figure in brackets are the national average figures. You will obviously therefore see how well The Coppice children have performed against other children nationally. At the current time, no national figures have been released for the 'Above expected standard' which is why we can't give them out yet. Our results were as follows:

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar: 86 % (72% National)	Above expected standard: 30%
Reading: 83% (73% National)	Above expected standard: 34%
Maths: 79% (73% National)	Above expected standard: 27%

We are very proud of our Year 6 children for their achievements and a huge well done goes to all of them! They all did their very best and their attitude toward their assessments was first class! A huge thank you and well done also goes to all of the Teachers and Teaching Assistants who have taught these children over the years. All of them have contributed greatly to the children's successes.

End-of-Year Reports:

Just a quick note about your child’s end-of-year report as you may be wondering about when you will be receiving these. We can confirm that they will be given out on Wednesday 19th July and will contain key information about how your child has performed over the course of this academic year. More details about your child’s report will accompany the report itself.

End-of-year book looks:

It was lovely yesterday to welcome many of you into school for our informal, end-of-year book look. Hopefully, you felt that this gave you all some quality time with your child to celebrate their achievements over the course of the year.

King Edward’s visit:

Four of our Year four children were lucky to get chance to experience the King Edward’s Summer School this week where they got chance to partake in a wide variety of activities such as a variety of sports, pond-dipping, languages, poetry and drama. This programme is part of the outreach work that Kind Edward’s engage with schools in and I know that the children who went really enjoyed the opportunity and the activities that they were involved in. A big thank you goes to Kind Edwards for providing this opportunity.

Sikh Education Day for Year 3:

Mr Singh, from The Sikh Education Service, visited Year 3 and Year 4 on Thursday 13th July. The children learned about the 5 K’s and the history behind Sikhism. Mr Singh brought in a lot of practical resources to help further the children's understanding of the five items that Sikhs have to wear at all times. They also learned about the values that Sikhs hold close and how they believe everybody is equal. They also had a practical demonstration of how Sikhs tie a turban, which the children found fascinating. Thank you, Mr. Singh, for giving the children such an enjoyable and informative learning experience.

These elements will offer a mix of colour, texture, and scent – experiences which are crucial to a child's development. Tom said 'I believe children learn best through being outside and up close with nature. With Belmont @ Home's help, we could deliver these experiences and make a significant impact on their learning'.

The staff at Belmont @ Home were more than happy to assist with this request. Sam Anderson, Manager at Belmont @ Home, Midlands, commented on their involvement: "We believe in supporting our community and local schools. To be able to contribute to a project that promotes learning and growth in such a tangible and impactful way is a true privilege."


