Dear Parents and Carers,

KEY INFORMATION FOR SEPTEMBER:

First day back:

The first day back in school for Years 1 - 6 will be Monday 6^{th} September. Nursery and Reception classes have got staggered starts beginning on the 6^{th} . These arrangements have been communicated separately.

Bubble arrangements and staggered starts:

Bubble arrangements will come to an end, as will staggered starts and finishes. On the next page of this newsletter, you will see a table that clearly outlines the new drop-off and collection arrangements. Please make sure that you take time to read these so that you are fully aware of where you need to go and at what times.

Punctuality:

I can't stress enough the importance of your child being on time for school. Please make sure that you arrive in enough time with your child to ensure that they are not disadvantaged by missing vital start of the day activities and also aren't left feeling worried or upset by having to enter their classrooms late.

Uniform:

As stated on previous communications, children will be expected to conform to the uniform and Physical Education kit expectations that have been widely communicated. Please ensure that your child meets these expectations.

Physical Education Kit:

Physical Education kit can continue to be worn on PE days next year. As I've said before, this has been a real success over the last eighteen months and has enabled the children to have a lot more Physical Education time.

Other equipment needed by Year groups:

During the period of Covid restrictions, we had clear expectations on what stationery equipment e.g. pens, pencils, pencil cases etc we wanted children to bring with them. For some year groups this will continue and for others it won't. Therefore, please see below for a breakdown of year group expectations:

There will be a one way system entering and leaving the school site at the end of the day.

At the end of the day., all parents must enter the school site through the top gate by the church, sticking to the path where possible.

All parents must walk through the school playground and leave the school site through the KS2 gate by the bungalow. These measures have been put in place so that our pupils do not need to walk through the carpark, but can exit school directly onto the school drive, then out to the pavement.


ACCESSIBILITY AND CHILDREN WITH SEND
