Thank you all for your understanding over the unprecedented events which have unfolded, (and are still unfolding) over the last week or so.

We do not know when things will change or when we will get more Government and the DfE advice but when we do we will communicate with you via the school website, online learning site or our official Facebook page. We are not planning on doing a weekly newsletter.

We know that many of you will have questions and we will do our best to answer these but please bear with us, we would appreciate your patience.

We are awaiting further information from Parent Pay about refunds. Please be assured that unspent school meal balances can be returned to your ParentPay Parent Account as part of our school closure process. We are currently working on our plans to support children of Key Workers and therefore politely request that parents do not send individual requests for refunds. School staff will be working next week to communicate our plans and to ensure refunds can be handled promptly where this is necessary. Thank you for your cooperation.

Regarding trip refunds, these too will be handled in the coming weeks. At present we are awaiting guidance on this as currently there is no way to bulk refund payments- meaning that each individual child has to be refunded separately for each time- a time consuming and laborious process. Again please be patient, it will be dealt with as swiftly as possible.

We will miss Mrs Higgitt and wish her well in her next adventure.


Boredom busters

Hopefully you will have taken a look at our online home learning site where you can access school work for your children. This has loads of information, ideas, websites etc. As we are made aware of more ideas and sites we will update as we go along. All emails and website links are detailed below.

The Science Fair will still accept entries and will continue to do so when we come back into school. Please ignore the dates on the poster below. We obviously won't be taking part in the regional event but this now means that we will be able to offer MORE prizes! So follow the guidelines below and have fun!

We are excited to be taking part in this year's Primary Science Fair. There will be a whole school competition and then an inter school final with 5 other schools. There is a Reception /Year 1 &2 / Year 3&4 and Year 5&6 category.

The project can be an age appropriate experiment to answer a question or a problem, along with a solution, or it could be a research project. It can be <u>on any area of science that interests your child</u>, for example 'How many stars can we see?', 'How does a hovercraft work?' or 'What would my family eat on the ISS if we were with Tim Peake?', 'What happens when I mix....and......?



When your child has carried out their investigation or research they have to make a display board to communicate their learning to others. This can be made from a large cardboard box opened out and then painted or covered in wrapping paper and held together with tape. It needs to have three panels of information (as shown).

This display board should show the project title/question/problem, what your child thinks the answer is, what they did to investigate their question, what they found and a conclusion. If they wish, they may also include a small model, experiment and/or project notes.

All projects need to be in school by **Friday**

take place during the week of 23rd March. A panel of judges will help to choose the best projects to represent the school at the Regional Primary Science Fair to be held on Wednesday 1st April.

You could call up an elderly relative or friend and interview them about childhood memories, or what it was like in the war. I'm sure they would appreciate some contact from the "outside world" and children may find it interesting to write down these memories.
