#### Winter uniform:

I firstly just want to say thank you to you all for ensuring that your children have returned to school in the correct winter uniform. They are looking wonderfully smart and are a credit to the school – fabulous to see!

### Well done Year 2 - we are proud of you!

Just before the half-term break, all of the Year 2 staff and children went on a trip to the local Transport Museum as part of their history unit 'How has transport changed over time'. The children had a fantastic day and learnt a great deal from their very knowledgeable and passionate guides at the museum.

It is a fantastic feeling for us a school when we receive feedback such as this. As you know, through our 'Coppice Way' behaviour curriculum, we teach our children how to conduct themselves and how to be respectful and responsible. We also teach our children how to be good learners. To therefore have people from outside our school comment on what a good job we are doing with these elements quite rightly fills us with pride. As parents and carers of these children, you can also feel hugely proud of your children for this praise and we thank you for how much you teach, support and encourage your children to be like this as well.

#### **Celebration assemblies:**

We began this week with our Celebration Assembles for Years 1-6 where we celebrated all of the excellent learning that took place over the first half-term of this academic year and they were wonderful occasions.

This year we have re-launched our School Team Point system in order to greatly value and recognise the achievements and hard work of our children on a day-to-day basis. All children earn team points across the days and weeks and these are added up across each half-term. During the Celebration Assemblies at the beginning of each half-term, we then award bronze, silver and gold medals to the top three team point earners in each class. The team that earns the most team points wins the team point trophy for that half-term. At the end of the year, the team with the most team points overall will earn a special reward.

In addition to the above, we are also now awarding half-termly 'star' trophies to a child in each year group (to be kept at home for that half-term) for the following categories: humanities (geography, history, religious education, Spanish, writing, maths, science, sport, arts and 'The Coppice Way'.

Through these trophies, we can recognise the many and varied talents of our children and ensure that all children feel that have something to aim for. This very much fits in with our vision of wanting The Coppice Primary School to be a school where, by the time a child leaves us in Year 6, there has been 'none of their talents left undiscovered'.

You can see in the tables on the next page of this newsletter who the trophy winners were and I'd like to again say a huge well done to all of the children who were given these awards on this occasion. I'm already excited to see who will get them next time! I also want to say a big well done to all of the children for all of the team points that they earned. Every team point counts towards the total and every team point represents something that a child has achieved which is always a cause for celebration!

### New school signage and notice boards:

I hope that you have all noticed the new signs that, as a Senior Leadership Team, we have had made and installed i.e. the Coppice crests on the gates and next to the school name on the wooden frontage, the new signs leading up to the school entrance and over the gate as you enter the pathway to the main entrance. They look absolutely fantastic and really add to our school's identity.

In addition, we now have two new information boards where this newsletter and any other key information will be displayed each week. These are located on the path outside the Care Club bungalow and by the Year 1 gate (where you all enter the school site for pick-up). If other parents mention to you that they haven't seen the newsletter, please let them know where they can find it each week – thank you.

I now also have my name on the new sign at the very front of school (seen from Shawhurst Lane) and I can't tell you the pride that this gives me. To be the Headteacher of this fantastic school and to serve you and your amazing children is a wonderful honour.

#### Windows in the Junior Hall:

Over half-term, we had some window art added to the windows in our junior hall to replace the old blinds that had been in there for many years. The children have been bowled over by the space, ocean and season themes and it has given the hall a huge lift and provided a lot more light. They have also caused a great deal of discussion amongst the children at lunchtimes. If you are passing school along Shawhurst Lane on a dark morning and the lights are on in the hall (above the wooden frontage), you will be able to see some of the artwork on the windows.

It has certainly been fabulous to share all of the above news and I hope you have enjoyed hearing about it. Therefore, that just leaves me to say that I hope you all have a lovely weekend, whatever you are doing, and we look forward to seeing you all on Monday.
