As always, I hope that you have all had a good week and are very much looking forward to the weekend with your children.

#### Eco-Council:

I would like to say a huge well done to all of the children who put themselves forward, both those who were elected and those who weren't. As you will see from Miss. Whiteley's item later on in this newsletter, we were extremely impressed with the effort that all of these children put in and for the ideas that they put forward in support of their campaigns.

It is a fabulous thing for the school to have an Eco-Council and I know that it will have a big impact moving forward in ensuring that any decisions that we make as a school always consider any possible impact on the environment. As Miss. Whiteley mentions, we will also be working towards achieving an Eco Schools' Green Flag award and I look forward to updating you over the coming months with our progress towards that goal.



#### Christmas:

I am thrilled that we are still able to hold our Year 1 and Year2 nativity productions and Nursery and Reception singalongs with parents present, especially after not being able to do these last year. I can't wait to see the children perform and I have to say, I think it will be a very emotional time.

I completely understand that not all schools are in the position to be able to hold live performances but, thankfully, we are fortunate to have a big enough hall space where we can accommodate visitors (albeit a more limited number than would usually have been the case) in a safe and socially distanced way. We have also put in other measures e.g. requesting parent/carers to take a lateral flow test before they attend performances and not serving teas and coffees, in order to prevent unnecessary mixing.We believe that these measures will ensure that we can hold the performances whilst at the same time not putting anyone's Christmas break at risk.

For our Junior children and classes, they will be recording some Christmas songs, which will be videoed and shared with parents. These will serve as a lovely keepsake and ensure that all parents, carers and children throughout the school can share some Christmas cheer together. As a large school, it is not possible to hold Junior Christmas performances for logistical reasons and I know that you will all understand this. Therefore, Junior children recording a Christmas item will be the approach that we will be taking in future years too. The children still have plenty of opportunity to perform to their parents though through their class assemblies and drama productions in Years 5 and 6.

I think you will all know by now that one event that we won't be having is our traditional Christmas Fayre. This was an event that unfortunately, due to the fact that you can't ensure social distancing and, due to the numbers of people who attend, we couldn't guarantee could be held safely. Hopefully this will be different next year! The plan, all being well, is therefore to make up for this with a fantastic Summer Revel – fingers crossed!

Finally, I hope that you all enjoy seeing the Christmas decorations that have been put in the small garden area and on the large conifer tree at the front of school. I'd like to thank the members of our school PTA and other volunteers for giving up their time to do the decorating – as usual, it is very much appreciated.

#### Red light/Green light game – please be vigilant:

We are urging parents and carers to be vigilant after we became aware of some of our children talking about and playing a version of a game from the Netflix series: Squid Games (rated certificate 15 and over).

The game is called 'red light, green light' although traditionally, it is known as 'Grandmother's Footsteps'. In the game, players must try to reach a finish line while the 'Grandmother's' back is turned. They must then freeze on the spot whenever the 'Grandmother' turns around or else they are out.

Thankfully, at present, we have not experienced our children playing a worrying version of the game, nor have we discovered that any of our children have directly viewed the show 'Squid Games'. We are aware though of a small group of pupils within school discussing the show, which has led us to believe that some children might be accessing content linked to the television series, possibly without their parents' knowledge. For example, social media users such as Tiktok or YouTube have posted their own versions of the game. Other developers e.g. Roblox have also made various mini-games based on the series.

As a primary school, we obviously strongly state that children should not watch Squid Game, nor should they be watching related content on other social media platforms. We know, as fact, that watching this kind of content can have a detrimental effect on children's mental health and can cause nightmares.

We are therefore advising all parents (we know that most of you already do) to regularly check the settings on your children's devices and to monitor their screen time so as to ensure that they only ever access age-appropriate content.

We also want to give a general reminder regarding the playing of other games such as Fortnight (certificate 12), Grand Theft Auto and Call of Duty (both certificate 18) as these are not appropriate for our children to be playing. Where we receive reports that children are playing these games, they will be treated as safeguarding concerns and will therefore need to logged on our school's safeguarding system.

As always, I hope that you have a lovely weekend with your children and we look forward to seeing you all on Monday when we start to count down towards the upcoming festivities.

# Weekend Football Coaching



Dear Parents,

I am pleased to inform you that, due to the huge success of our football courses over the last 20 years, we are following up the football coaching programme for the season starting in January 2022. The course will run for approximately 12 weeks and the programme is for boys and girls aged between 4 and 12.

#### About our Course

  - The course is run by F.A qualified coaches, who are DBS checked, and hold an advanced premier skills qualification, they are currently working with children, enabling them to learn essential football techniques, building CONFIDENCE, improving FITNESS and providing the most important ingredient FUN1
- Children will be fully supervised at all times, although parents are welcome to stay and watch.
- Each child will be provided with a football for individual practice and their progress will be recorded each week.
- It is an indoor course held in the sports hall, therefore children may wear trainers and sportswear
