

# The Coppice Whole School Newsletter Friday 10th December 2021

Dear Parents and Carers,



As always, I hope that you have all had a good week and are very much looking forward to the weekend with your children.

#### Thank you to the school staff!

As we approach the Christmas break, I want to take this opportunity to praise and thank my wonderful staff for everything that they have done for The Coppice children over the course of this term. My newsletter, quite rightly, always praises our amazing children for their achievements but, on this occasion and for a number of reasons, I want to start off with the staff. By staff, I mean everyone who works for The Coppice family: teachers, teaching assistants, special support assistants, office staff, site staff, lunchtime staff and cleaners.

I can honestly say that I feel blessed to have such a dedicated and hard-working staff, who have the welfare and progress of our children at the heart of everything they do. This is obviously what, as Headteacher, I ask and demand of them but, without doubt, our staff demand these things of themselves because they want The Coppice to be the best place that it can be for the children in their care.

I can't deny that this term has had many challenges caused by the current situation in wider society. Many staff have contracted Covid and a number have had on-going health effects from this. However, despite this, I have not had one member of staff come to me to say that they don't feel they can be in school or that they are too worried to be. I'm sure, at times, some have understandably felt like this but, in spite of this, all I have seen is overwhelming positivity and a desire to keep going for the children. Those who have needed to be off due to illness, have always been desperate to return which says a huge amount about them.

I know that many of you will thank the staff over the coming week and this is always greatly appreciated, but it was also very important to me that I shared my thanks to them with you as well.

#### Staff leaving at Christmas:

On the subject of staff, we have three members of staff leaving at Christmas. Two of them: Mrs. Walker (part-time Nursery teacher) and Mrs. Green (part-time Nursery Special Support Assistant) are leaving us permanently. Mrs. Walters (Reception cover teacher in RF) will be leaving us temporarily to go on maternity leave.

Mrs. Walker will be leaving us to become a trainer for the Read Write Inc Phonics programme. Phonics is something that she is very passionate about and, because an opportunity came along that doesn't happen very often, she felt that she couldn't turn it down. Mrs. Walker will be replaced in Nursery by one of our teachers: Miss. Kirby, who is returning from maternity leave after Christmas. She has spent three days in Nursery this week and the children have loved meeting and getting to know her. Miss. Kirby has loved it too! With Miss. Kirby going into Nursery, Miss. Perry has agreed to see the year out with 3KP. This is great news and I know that both children and parents will be reassured by this continuity.

Mrs. Green has been a great appointment for The Coppice and has done an excellent job supporting individual children in Nursery. I know that her decision to leave was a hard one for her but, due to personal circumstances, she has had to make it.

On behalf of the school, I want to thank both Mrs. Walker and Mrs. Green for all they have done for the school during their time with us and we wish them all the very best for the future.

Finally, we wish Mrs. Walters all the very best for her maternity leave. We look forward to hearing news of the safe arrival of her twin boys and to the announcement of their names. We will miss you Mrs. Walters!

#### Choir at Hollywood Christian Life Centre:

Our involvement, as a school, within the local community is of the utmost importance to us. You will remember me giving you details of our School Council attending the Remembrance Day service at The Drake's Cross Memorial back in November. It therefore gives me great pleasure to tell you about another event that some of our children have attended.

On Thursday, the School Choir visited The Hollywood Christian Life Centre (on Simms Lane) where they joined the congregation for their festive coffee morning **(see photo below).** Whilst there, they entertained all those attending with a range of Christmas songs, which went down really well and were greatly enjoyed by all. The children's conduct was described as 'impeccable' and as always, we were extremely proud of our children exhibiting 'The Coppice Way'. A big thank you to Pastor Steve Crosthwaite for inviting us, to Ms Croft for organsing and to Ms Juneman, Mrs Pickersgill and Mrs Field for accompanying them.


### Christmas Meals arrangements


It would be lovely to have a group of parents who could hopefully commit to attending the meetings on a regular basis but of course we welcome all parents/carers to any of the meetings.

### **Community News**



Many of you will be out buying Christmas presents for family and friends. E-scooters are becoming more popular and your child/grandchild may be asking for one as a present. Before buying one please consider the following:

**What is an e-scooter?** Electrical scooters (also known as e-scooters) come under the category of "powered transporters". This also covers a range of other personal transport devices which are powered by a motor. "Powered transporters" fall within the legal definition of a motor vehicle under the Road Traffic Act 1988. Therefore, the rules that apply to motor vehicles, also apply to e-scooters.

As a motor vehicle, they must comply with various pieces of Road Traffic Legislation, including but not limited to:

- driving with a licence
- driving/riding with insurance
- driving/riding other than on a road
- need to be taxed

It is not currently possible to get appropriate insurance for privately owned e-scooters, meaning it is illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces.

School Admissions 2022 - First & Primary School Application Reminder

I am writing to remind you that the closing date for applications for a place in all First and Primary Schools is **Saturday 15 January 2022**.

If you haven't done so already can you please ensure that you submit your application on-line using the <u>Worcestershire Children First - Citizen Portal</u> https://emsi.worcestershire.gov.uk/CitizenPortal LIVE/en?ReturnURL=%2FCitizenPortal LIVE%2F

If you are unable to make your application using the on-line system, please contact School Admissions on 01905 822700 to request an application form. Please note, this application should also be received by School Admissions by **Saturday 15 January 2022**.

It is vitally important that your application is made before the closing date. Late applications receive a lower priority which could mean that you are not offered a place at your preferred school.

If you have already made your application and have received an email to confirm this, please disregard this message.

If you live in Birmingham and pay your council tax to Birmingham (rather than Bromsgrove Council) You should apply through the Birmingham portal.
