Everyone at The Coppice wants to wish our Year 6 pupils all the very best for the future as they prepare to transition to their respective high schools. It has been an absolute pleasure to be in the hall this week, watching their fantastic leavers' productions and celebrating their time with us. We are extremely proud of these children for what they have accomplished this year and during their time with us. Their attitude to their Year 6 SAT tests has been first class and we couldn't have asked for any more from them. We know that these children will go on to achieve great things in the future and we can't wait to see them again in the future and to find out how they are getting on. As someone once said, 'Once a Coppice kid, always a Coppice kid'! It is also the end of an association with the school for a number of our families as they will no longer have a child at the school. I want to thank all of them for their support of their children and the school over the years and, as with the children, we want to say that it will be great to see them all again at some point in the future.

School reports:

All children from Years 1-6 received their school reports on Wednesday. For Mrs. Ashwell and I, it was an absolute pleasure to read these reports and to see how well the children have progressed this year – well done children! If for some reason, you have not received your child's report though e.g. due to absence, please make sure that you contact your child's teacher and they will make sure that they get it to you as soon as possible, via post if necessary.

Playground development work begins!

It has been hugely exciting to watch our planned playground developments start this week. This will carry on over the course of the summer and will be getting close to completion by the time that we return in September. The playground will have been extended round the back of The Care Club huts and the main, existing Junior playground will have been completely resurfaced. This is the first time that this has ever happened and it's not before time. The existing surface is tired and worn and not great on the children's knees! We will also have had a Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA) built down the side of Forest School. This will greatly enhance our Physical Education curriculum and provision and allow for games like football and basketball to be played safely in a contained area. These are exciting developments and have only been possible due to the school's financial diligence over many years.





Celebration assemblies:

We have held our final round of celebration assemblies this week and Mrs. Ashwell and I have been busy presenting certificates to all year groups from Reception through to Year 5. Obviously, Year 6 were celebrated during their Leavers' assemblies, as mentioned above. Celebration assemblies are always lovely occasions and it has been great to end the year with so much to celebrate.

Coppice Gymnastic Competitions:

I want to say a huge well done to all of The Coppice gymnasts who competed in the two in-school competitions that we held over the course of the last two weeks. These competitions are extremely important because they give an opportunity for all of the gymnasts in school, from the very youngest and least experienced to the oldest and most experienced, a chance to compete in front of peers, friends and families. This is a huge moment for a number of these children and is another confidence building block for them. It takes a lot of courage to walk out in front of a crowd and perform an individual or group routine so I want to say a huge well done to every child who took part – you can all be very proud of yourselves. Carter and the rest of The Coppice coaches too for their efforts in organising these competitions and for their hard work with all of the children throughout the year. We truly are lucky to have such dedicated staff.

THE COPPICE NURSERY AND SCHOOL START AND END OF THE DAY TIMINGS 2023

TIMINGS MEET THE STIPULATED 32.5 HOUR WEEK

*Nursery children will enter through the small side gate by the Reception classrooms at 8.30 am every day and line up in the outdoor area (as they do now). Doors open at 8.45 am every day for all full-time children and first half and second half of the week children apart from on a Wednesday when first half of the week children enter at 8.30 am. Second half of the week children start at 12.15 pm on a Wednesday and enter through the side gate by the school office.

*Reception external classroom doors open at 8.30am and close at 8.40am

*KS1 and KS2 gates open at 8.25am.

<u>KS1</u>: Year 1 and Year 2 will enter through the top gate by Church and will play out until the whistle is blown at 8.40 am, which will be the official start time.

<u>KS2</u>: Years 3 - Year 6 will continue to enter through the main front gate but will now not have to go straight to class. If they wish, they will have the opportunity to stay outside with their friends until the whistle is blown at 8.40 am. The playground will be supervised by the Senior Leadership Team and other support staff. At 8.40 am, the children will make their own way to the classrooms from the playground ready for an 8.45 am official start.

*If children would still prefer to go to class to read quietly or to speak to the teacher at the start of the day, then that is fine. **Teachers will be in class from 8.25am to supervise them.**

Please note:

- KS1 (Years 1 and 2) gate closes at 8.40 am
- KS2 (Year 3 to Year 6) gate closes at 8.45 am

End of the day arrangements:

Nursery children (full-time, first half of the week and second half of the week) finish at 2.45 pm every day (Gates open at 2.40 pm) apart from on a Wednesday when first half of the week children leave at 11.30 and second half of the week children leave at 3.15 pm.

Reception children will finish at 3:00 pm (school day: 8:30 - 3:00pm)

Year One and Year Two will finish at 3.10 pm (school day: 8:40-3:10pm)

KS2 will finish at 3:15pm (school day: 8:45 - 3:15pm)

Clubs

We have had quite a few enquiries about the After School Clubs that will be running in the new school year. We are currently working on offering a varied list of clubs and have already sent a couple of emails to gauge interest for some new clubs - these were sent to the appropriate age groups only so don't worry if you didn't see them.

Further information will be sent out in the first week of the new term.


David Morris's Multi sports club will be continuing to run in the Autumn Term and we will distribute the enrolment letter as soon as we receive it.

Cool Milk





Children in any year group can have milk in school. It's free for children under 5 and easy for children over 5 to register.

If you no longer want your child to have milk, don't forget to cancel through Coolmilk.com or you will still be charged.

School milk is free for children in receipt of means tested Free School Meals. You should apply using the information here.

FSM application

If you have a change of circumstances or think you may be entitled to means tested Free School Meals you can apply online. You will need to sign onto the portal (it's the same one you used to make your application for school)

If you qualify for FSM you will also be entitled to help with trips etc.

Please note that this is different to the Universal Free School Meals that all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive BUT if you are in these year groups and think you are eligible financially then you should still apply as you could still be entitled to help within school.
