

# The Coppice Whole School Newsletter Friday 28th January 2022

Dear Parents and Carers,

Hopefully you've all had a good week and are once again looking forward to the weekend with your children. We've had another week packed full of learning so, without doubt, the children are ready for some down time too.

#### **Uniform and PE kit:**

We have noticed this week that there are a few children wearing items of clothing and footwear that do not fully comply with our uniform and PE kit expectations. Obviously, the overwhelming majority of children are meeting all of the expectations and I want to thank parents and carers for ensuring that this is always the case.

As you will all know from my previous communications, we are a school that strongly believes in the many positive benefits of wearing a school uniform and a standard P.E. /Forest Rangers kit. This is therefore our school policy and, as such, we expect every child to meet these expectations in full, in the same way that they will be expected to when they go to secondary school.

I therefore want to remind all parents and carers of the expectations (see the school website or the noticeboard near the school office.) and ask that changes are made, if needed, for your child to meet them in every respect.

As I have said many times before, our uniform expectations are purposefully designed to be both achievable and affordable. However, if for financial reasons you are finding it difficult to meet the expectations or are in receipt of means-tested free school meals and need some support in purchasing items of uniform or P.E. kit, please contact our school office so that we can have a chat about how we may be able to help you in purchasing items.

Another option for parents and carers is to contact our school Parents and Teachers' Association (PTA) directly at thecoppiceschoolpta@gmail.com or to contact them via the school office as they have a lot of excellent condition second-hand uniform in a variety of sizes that you can either have or give a small donation for. We will also be holding a uniform exchange event at some point during the next couple of weeks where you can either obtain or donate good -quality second-hand uniform. We will let you know the date of this soon.

#### Science Day and appeal for help:

I am really pleased to announce, and to give you notice, that on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> March, we will be having a Science Day in school that will coincide with National Science Week, which runs between the 14-18<sup>th</sup> March. On this day, the children will be off their usual timetable for the day and will partake in many exciting science challenges, investigations and activities.

We already have a brilliant science curriculum here at The Coppice and are one of the few primary schools fortunate enough to benefit from having our very own science lab. For parents and carers who are new to the school, this is known as the 'Phiz Lab'. This fantastic resource enables our children to have the opportunity to conduct science investigations in an environment outside of their classroom, which I know they greatly enjoy and look forward to.

Through our science curriculum and enrichment activities e.g. Science Club, we want to inspire our children to have a love of science and its individual subject disciplines: physics, chemistry and biology. By doing the things that we do, we hope that many of our children will want to take their science learning to greater advancement at secondary school when they leave us, and that some will want to pursue areas of science as a career.

Linked to the above, during the Science Day, we would very much like parents, carers or other relatives who work in the science field to come into school and talk to some of the children about their job and what it entails and then answer questions. If this is something that you or a family member are able to give up some time to do, we would greatly appreciate it. This is why I am publicising the Science Day a number of weeks in advance, as we fully understand that you may need to book time off work. We know that the children would get a great deal from learning about your job from you and therefore I hope that we will get some offers to help us. It would be really great if some offers came from women who work in any field of the science world.

It is very important to us as a school that we demonstrate to children that science careers are open to both genders to aspire to. Linked to this, on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> February we will be holding assemblies linked to women working in science throughout history.

Mrs. Tomkinson, our Science Leader in school, will be sending home more details of the day closer to the time as well as setting an optional homework task that we think the children will really enjoy.

#### Reception celebration certificates:

It was lovely to be able to go into all of the Reception classes this week in order to give out certificates and stickers to some of the children. It was fabulous to reward children for reasons such as being kind to others, always following 'The Coppice Way' behaviour expectations and making fantastic progress with writing.

What really impressed me was the way that the children, who weren't receiving a certificate on this occasion, were so pleased for their friends and listened so intently to the reasons why they had received them. To be able to appreciate and recognise the achievements of others is something that we work hard on with the children at The Coppice, so to see this so clearly was wonderful to see and a real highlight of my week. I'm already looking forward to going back to Reception in a few weeks' time in order to hand out more certificates.

#### King Edward's maths challenge:

Some of our Year 5 pupils attended the maths challenge at King Edward's Grammar School this afternoon. This is always a fantastic opportunity for our children and one that they really enjoy. In the competition, they get chance to compete against a number of different schools on a range of maths challenges and to put their mathematical brains to the test. Obviously, at the time of writing, I don't know what the results are but I greatly look forward to letting you know next week. Thank you to Mrs Giles and Mr. Mace for accompanying the children.

#### Phonics workshops, rhyme time and storytelling sessions in Early Years and Key Stage 1:

We are fully aware that the issues that have been caused by the pandemic over the last couple of years have prevented us from being able to have parents into school in order to demonstrate and explain key areas of children's early reading journey in a face-to-face way. We fully recognise how valuable you, as parents and carers, find sessions such as this. I therefore want to reassure you all that I have had conversations with Mrs. Flynn (Early Years' Leader), Mrs. Russell (Reception teacher and Phonics Leader) and Mrs. Tomkinson (Year 1 Leader) this week as to how we can start moving forward with holding events such as phonics workshops, rhyme time and storytelling sessions again at some point after February half-term provided that it is safe to do so. As a school, we are fully committed to doing whatever we can to enable parents to support their children with their learning at home. More information will follow regarding the above after half-term.

#### Supporting parents with the curriculum:

Linked to the above, we are also currently exploring the ways in which we can best support parents and carers to help their children with their learning in all year groups at The Coppice. Some of these, as mentioned above, will hopefully be face-to-face. However, we would also very much like to start providing some short videos and demonstrations on our website that explain key elements of how we approach learning in school and how we teach the children key skills e.g. reading, division or multiplication. I know that many of you would greatly appreciate this. I will keep you informed as we move forward with these plans.

That just leaves me to wish you all a lovely weekend. As always, we greatly look forward to welcoming the children bright and early on Monday morning.




## School Council Bulletin

Our first meeting in the new year was an exciting one! The key issues that we are actioning at the moment are:

- Planning a fundraiser- we are going back to our classes to find out what they would like to raise funds for from our three possible options- a school garden, new equipment or a new safe space in school.
- School dinner options- we are meeting with Chef Matt to ask for condiments to be provided at lunchtime.
- Lunchtimes- we discussed how we were finding the new lunchtime arrangements. There was positive feedback on the changes since Christmas, with a few areas for improvement that we have fed back to Mr Hutt and Mrs Ashwell.



## Crisp packet recycling



Don't forget we are recycling any kind of crisp packet! There is a post box in the lunch hall where children can post their empty packets. You could collect at home and bring in too. If your child does not eat their lunch in the old hall, Eco Ambassadors will be responsible for collecting the crisp packets from the class and posting them into our recycling bin.

The scheme is run by TerraCycle who aim to eliminate the idea of waste by recycling the 'non-recyclable'. Accepted waste includes ANY brand of crisp packet as long as they are empty and not folded. Once the packets are collected from school, they will be separated by plastic type, cleaned and extruded into plastic pellets to make new recycled products.

This is something that we are really excited about and we hope that by everyone doing their small bit we can make a big difference.




There will also be a Break the Rules on April Fools Day (1st April 2022) fundraiser. More details to follow.


