Dear Parents and Carers,

The children have worked very hard over the course of this term and have achieved a great deal – they certainly deserve the break. As this is the last newsletter before we break up, it's a bumper edition packed full of fantastic news!

### **Incredible sporting success!**

On Monday, as I mentioned in last week's newsletter, thirty-four Year 5 and 6 children represented the school at the Bromsgrove Winter Games, which was held at Bromsgrove School. I am therefore absolutely thrilled and bursting with pride to announce that our boys' team came first in their competition, thereby becoming Worcestershire County Champions! Our girls' team also did incredibly well and finished second by an extremely fine margin of only four points!

We also had our hockey team competing at the games and they too enjoyed great success by winning every game that they played. Not only did they have success on the pitch but they were also recognised for their fantastic attitude and sportsmanship by being placed third in the 'values' award, something that these children can be rightly proud of.

This is the first time that a primary school has achieved such a level of success and is again testament to the huge numbers of talented children at The Coppice. Obviously though, talent is one thing but it always needs to be combined with a fantastic attitude and our children have that in abundance! Once again, all of our children gave a brilliant account of themselves, exhibiting great sportsmanship and humbleness in victory and, as always, we were as proud of them for this as we were with their sporting success.

Behind a great team though, there is always a great coaching team and I therefore also have to give huge credit to both Mr. Edwards and Miss. Wells for training the children so well to achieve their potential. We are very lucky to have such dedicated staff here at The Coppice and we value them greatly.

I also want to take this opportunity to extend our thanks to Arden Estates for sponsoring us and for purchasing a full set of embroidered Coppice tracksuit tops for our children to wear. You can see the children proudly wearing these in the photos below and I think you'll agree how smart they look. I know that both Mr. Edwards and Miss. The dandelion is the symbolic flower for service children and the morning gave these children a chance to discuss their lives and experiences. I think that you'll agree that what Jack (Year 4), George (Year 3), Rose (Reception), Ben (Year 2) and Amelia (Year 6) created is stunning.




Harry and Ethan - drumming achievement!

## **Worcestershire School Games**

On Monday 4th April, we took 35 Coppice children to Bromsgrove School to represent Redditch in the Worcester School Games finals. There were 8 Year 4 children who qualified on 8th March 2022 in the Values Competition for Quicksticks Hockey (we scored highest in all of our games for the values Respectfulness, Honesty and Teamwork, all of these values which The Coppice and the School Games Organisation promote.) We also took 13 Year 5 and 6 girls and 15 Year 5 and 6 boys who qualified on Friday 4th February in Indoor Athletics.

When we arrived at Bromsgrove School, we checked in and were given a team shirt (our colour was black which represented the value 'Self-Belief'). The children and adults were directed to their event and the games began!!

In the Athletics, the Year 5 and 6 girls were first up with the obstacle relay race which consisted of going through a high stepper, completing 10 speed bounces, jumping over 2 hurdles, deflecting off the backboard and racing to tag the next person in the team. The team was fantastic and came first. The team consisted of: Poppy D, Hollie C, Alana W and Leila S. The boys were up next! With the same course in place the boys also managed to beat all their opponents and came first. This team consisted of: Briley, Ollie, Shay and Conor.

Next came the 1+1 relay and 2+2 relay for the girls and the boys with both teams coming in second place for the 1+1, the girls coming second in the 2+2 and boys coming forth for their 2+2. The girls team of 2 consisted of: Ava S and Ciera S for the 1+1 and Amelia G and Lily S for the 2+2. The boys team of 2 consisted of Jack M and Gabe for the 1+1 and Noah and Briley for the 2+2.

Whilst these races were going on, the field events had started! A massive congratulations to all the children below who competed in their event. They did exceptionally well. Unfortunately, the children are not placed individually for these events, their scores are added together to make a total score but from what Mr Edwards and I can tell, from feedback from the children, they all did extremely well and came first or second place in every event they did.

The final races of the morning were the 6 lap Paarlauf boys and girls. The girls team consisted of Miyaa and Beth who, after a tough start, managed to finish fourth in their race and the boys team, Fred and Reid, fought all the way to second place, narrowly missing first place by a few centimetres!! The final few races were the Over/Under boys and girls, both teams finishing first in their section. The boys team consisted of Sam, Ollie, Shay and Conor. The girls team consisted of Poppy D, Beth, Holly and Alana. The final race was the ever exciting 4x1 relay race! The boys team, Jack M, Gabe, Fred and Reid, fought to the very end of their race and came in second place, just missing first place by a few centimetres! The girls team, Ava, Ciera, Amelia and Lily, did a fantastic job and came first in their group!

Finally, after what seemed like forever, the results were in! The children sat down on the sporthall floor and the girls' results were announced first. They came 2nd out of the 5 schools who were competing, missing first place by 4 points!! Next, the boys' result was announced. They came 1st out of the 5 schools who were competing. They all received a medal which was presented to them by the School Games Organisers.

Whilst all this was happening, Mr Laight was with the Year 4 Quicksticks Hockey team! They were playing in the values section of the competition so we were scored for each match based on our values, rather than how many goals we scored. They played 5 games against other schools from Worcestershire and did fantastically well with winning all of their games. Overall, after having our games marked by the School Games Volunteers, we came in third place and won a lovely trophy which is now displayed in our school entrance. I was so proud of all of the Year 4 children. It was a big event and they conducted themselves brilliantly. They showed The Coppice way and were respectful, honest and most importantly played well in a team and showed passion for their sport!

Mr Edwards and Myself and so thrilled with the result. We have never been to represent Redditch at a School Games before and have never won! A big thank you to all the children for their commitment to their sport!
