They must not run around and must remain in either their pushchair / buggy or remain on the parent's knee throughout the performance. Access to the hall for parents / carers is via the external Church doors so they do not have to enter the school. Children will access the hall from the school doors. Hand sanitiser will be placed by the Church doors and parents / carers will be encouraged to use this. In light of the updated Government guidance on 08/12/21 Face coverings should be worn by pupils and students in year 7 and above (which would be children who were aged 11 on 31 August 2021), staff and visitors in communal areas, unless exempt. Parents / carers will now be asked to wear masks not only when entering / exiting the hall, but also throughout the performance whilst seated. There is a limit of 3 parents / carers for each child performing. Seating is set out in threes, socially distanced around the hall. (The hall has a capacity for 285 seated / 511 standing, but we are limiting visitors to 90 for each performance.) Parents / carers must remain in their seats. No refreshments will be provided to prevent mixing. External doors will remain open to ensure there is adequate ventilation. After the performance, children will exit back through the school doors whilst parents will leave through the Church doors and then collect children at the end of the day as usual.	5	2	10
