### Smartphone Virtual Reality - can you help?

As flagged up in a previous newsletter, you may well have had feedback from your children about their Google virtual reality headset session they had in school recently. It was an amazing experience that the children really enjoyed. If you do a Youtube search for 'Smartphone Virtual Reality', you'll know exactly what the children experienced.

A Google rep brought 60 headsets into school, enabling two whole classes at a time to have a go. I would like to take the opportunity to thank Mr Laight for setting this up.

The potential for learning here is incredible, really bringing learning to life. Children were able to explore the human digestive system, see ancient Rome and visit the moon; all in a virtual world delivered by a smart-phone app.

I cannot help thinking that we are on the verge of a revolution in learning with this technology, with more such learning apps planned by Google, adding to an already extensive library of apps. It was wonderful listening to the gasps of amazement coming from the children as they were experiencing the virtual worlds through their own individual headsets.

The app is accompanied by iPad teaching software that links to each headset, directing the children's learning.

I can envisage a time when children start a new topic in Science, History or Geography and they all have an introductory session to the topic using this virtual technology. How brilliant would that be?

The Coppice wants to make a start at building this technology. However, we need 5.5 inch smart-phones! Accordingly, we are making an appeal for any smart-phone that parents might have but not need because they have upgraded, or if anybody has a contact with a business that might be upgrading their phones that might be willing to donate old ones to us. All will be gratefully received, and make a difference to learning in school.

When the Year 6 competition winners travelled to King Edwards (Five Ways) School last Thursday Emma was lucky to be chosen to ask Michael Foale her question; Who is the most important member of the crew on the space station and why? He replied that everyone had an important role and no one person was more important than another. Some members were pilots, others scientists, each had a crucial job to perform and the mission would not have succeeded if someone was missing.

She wrote later "He did an interesting presentation on his space shuttle missions to the ISS (International Space Station). He showed videos of a few of his launches and how life is in space. He also inspired us to follow our dreams and not let a setback stop you from achieving whatever you want to".
