

We have, pretty much, excelled across the board, achieving results higher than national averages (by a considerable margin in most cases).

I summarise these results, for this academic year, below. These figures are all the more impressive when you consider that Ofsted consider us as an average school from a sociodemographic perspective.

Year 1 National Phonics Screening outcome:

Coppice 90% / National 83%

KS2 SATs (% at Age Related Expectation):

Reading = Coppice 95% / National 75%

SPAG (spelling, punctuation and grammar) = Coppice 87% / National 78%

Maths = Coppice 90% / National 76% Writing = Coppice 84% / National 78%

Science = Coppice 98% (No national figure available).

Our achievements have not just been academic though:

Our footballers, gymnasts, netball players, golfers, archers and athletes excelled themselves in local competitions. For the third year running Coppice children won Wythall Fun Run for us (headed by Finlay F in Y4).

Our scientists have represented the school at events at Birmingham University and Joshua P won our Year 6 Scientist of the year award.

We have raised thousands of pounds for our school at our many PTA events and have raised money for Red Nose Day, the NSPCC, The British Legion (Poppy selling), for SSAFA on our Armed Forces Day and who could forget our visit from the real Pudsey Bear during our Children in Need fundraising day. We donated food to Birmingham Mission and Sparkhill food bank at our Harvest Festival. Chloe and Katie had their long hair cut off for The Princess Trust and Dhruv completed a 5k mud run in aid of "Matt's Mission". Thank you all for your support of the school and our designated charities we are proud of having such compassionate parents and children at The Coppice. Our choir performed at Young Voices in front of a huge audience at the Genting Arena. Our Year 5 & 6 Drama club performed "Pirates of the Currybean". Every child performed in their class assembly and at our various Christmas productions. We had a talent competition for Children in Need and our celebration of Mrs Furnell's teaching career,

We also witnessed everyone's determination and resilience in the snowy conditions. Thank you for your support. We continue to be proud of all our children's academic, sporting, musical, artistic and individual achievements.

Quad athletics finals

On Friday 6th July, 21 Athletes travelled to Abbey Stadium for the finals of the district athletics competition.

This is the largest number of athletes that Coppice have taken to the finals following the semi-final qualification event.

It's worthy of note that the majority of schools competing were middle schools from Redditch with dedicated PE departments.

There were some fantastic performances and, including the relay medals, Coppice came away with 12 Gold, 3 Silver and 1 Bronze.

Uniform.

Don't forget that children can wear either standard or summer uniform on their return in September. After October half term all children should be in standard uniform only. Also we would like to confirm that KS1 and KS2 girls CAN wear pinafore dresses.

Arrival and departures - all gates open at 8.25 am. Years 2-6 enter through the main gate nearest the Site Manager's bungalow, Reception enter through the Reception gate and Year 1 through the large gates adjacent to St Mary's/Infant Hall. Collections are from the playgrounds. Years 3-6 in KS2 playground at 3.15pm (enter through gates near the bungalow), Year 2 (3.10pm) from the KS1 playground between the church and the field (enter through Year 1 gates). Year 1 (3.10pm) and Reception (3pm) from the classroom doors, please enter from large gates by Infant Hall/ Church.

Barrier.

There will be NO parent parking on site in September. Following our letter recently we would like to remind you that parents without disabled blue badges will be challenged by Coppice and Woodrush staff who will be manning the barrier. Please do not attempt to come on site if you do not hold proof of disability. This applies to parents dropping off and collecting from Care Club and Nursery as well.

Parent Pay.

Parent Pay will be closed down for this school year after school on Friday 20th July. It will hopefully be reopened for meal bookings and payments on 3rd September.

Parents of children in current 2K who will be going into 3M swimming next year, please note that you won't be able to pay until Parent Pay reopens.

Parents of all Year 2 Children going into Year 3, please note that you will be unable to pay for your trip in September until Parent Pay reopens.

Parents of current Year 3 going into Year 4 wanting to pay for Upton Warren – your balances will be transferred over to the new school year and you can continue to pay in instalments when Parent Pay reopens.
