A homework reminder...

At The Coppice, we believe that homework makes a huge difference to children's academic progress and we rely heavily on support from parents to encourage children to participate. We would like to thank parents who do support with homework and hope to see this continue.

Mr Heptinstall's Timetable Challenge:

This timetable challenge will run for the next 5 weeks. Each week children will bring home 100 multiplication questions to practice. Please encourage children to complete this 4 times a week.

Spellodrome: The children are expected to achieve 500 points weekly as a minimum. In addition to this they are now expected to complete the look, say, cover, write and cover tasks in their homework diary. They will be tested on these words on **Mondays in 5L and 5AD** and on **Wednesdays in 5J** and then given 6 new spellings to learn.

Reading: Please continue to read at least three times per week (or more) and denote all reading with a daily signature in your child's homework diary which should be handed in **Mondays in 5L and 5AD** and **Wednesdays in 5J.**
