


We are learning....



Maths:

In Maths, we will be consolidating our knowledge of concretely making arrays. We will then use arrays to add equal groups together, writing the repeated addition number sentence . You can practice this as home, using equipment such a Cheerios.



Topic:

In Topic, we will be learning about the British explorer James Cook. We will be exploring facts about his life, and his discovery of the East Coast of Australia. We will use the facts we find out, to write a fact file about him. What can you find out at home about James Cook?

We will be sharing new vocabulary with the children that will support our learning in class. Can you use the word at home? We have sent home a template for you to share and display the word at home together.
