The timetable for elections is as follows:

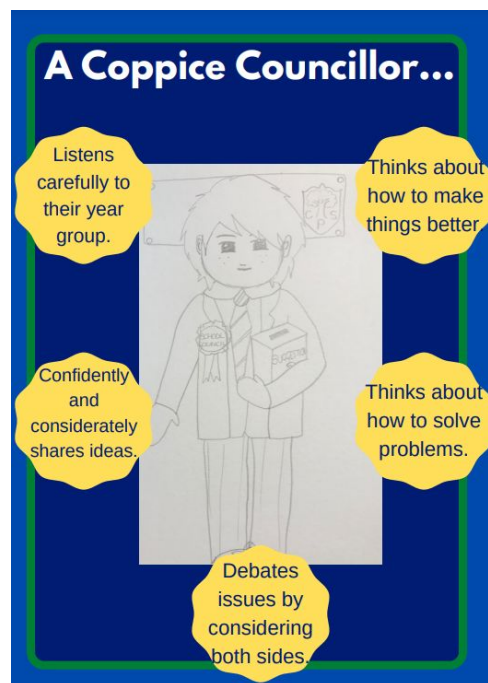
Monday 11th October: Year 3

Reading for Pleasure

Why is it so important that children love reading?

How can you encourage children to read at home?

We often get asked questions like these at parent information evenings and this video is a general summary of the answers. At The Coppice, we want to develop readers for life who love to read and reap the enormous benefits of being a reader. There is strong evidence linking reading for pleasure and educational outcomes but the benefits of reading for pleasure go beyond this and stretch throughout a person's life.

Mr Laight, our Assistant Headteacher, is responsible for leading reading at The Coppice. He also volunteers for the Open University and UK Literacy Association, training teachers on the best ways to develop reading communities.

We have posted a video on our official Facebook page and in this video, he shares a summary of the research into the benefits of reading for pleasure, as well as some of the ways you can encourage reading at home. If you find this video helpful, let us know and Mr Laight will turn it into a regular series of updates.

Restart a heart day
