Mymaths:

In our maths lessons this week we are recapping and revising some of the maths topics we have previously covered this year.

There will be MyMaths activities to consolidate their learning on shapes.

There are three activities which need to be completed this week to consolidate the learning we have been completing in class.

- Symmetry
- Properties of shape
- Lines of quadrilaterals

Spelling shed:

The children are expected to complete 4 games weekly on playedshed.com. This week the children have been practising words which end with the suffix <ary>. This suffix has several meanings, including 'a person who', 'a place where', 'a thing which', 'pertaining to', 'relating to' and 'having the characteristics of'.

Reading: Children should continue to read at least three times per week. This is so important even though the children read for 30-40 minutes a day in school it is still important they are reading at home.

Topic:

We have begun our new topics for this half term this week.

In science we are looking at animals and their habitats. This will include how we classify animals and looking at how microorganisms can be used.

As part of our geography unit this term we will be looking at how suitable the modern way of life is.
