Weekend Task-

For example, if you hide a pen you could say ‘p-e-n’ to your child, if you hide a car you could say ‘c-ar’ to your child etc. If your child is confident at hearing the sounds and blending them together, you could challenge them to choose an object to hide. Are they able to segment the sounds to give you a clue?
