Weekend Activity

At Nursery, we have and will continue to complete a range of activities to help the children to understand how things grow and/or may change.

This weekend perhaps you could continue this at home. Maybe you and your child could crack open a raw egg and talk about what it looks like. What happens if you then boil or fry an egg... how does it change? What happens to bread when it is toasted? Does it look and feel any different? What happens if you take ice cubes out of the freezer? Do they stay hard or do they begin to melt and change in appearance? Or maybe you could melt some chocolate and make rice krispie cakes?
