Activity to Try

This week we have been practising to accurately count objects and to guess what one more and one less would be. It would be great if you could practise counting at home over the weekend. Below are a few activities that you could try.

- Go on a nature walk and collect interesting things along the way.
 Encourage your child to count the different groups and discuss which has more/fewer.
- Collect objects from around the home. You could turn it into a treasure hunt and read clues. For example, five spoons, two socks etc. You could encourage your child to write down amounts and draw objects for a sibling to find.
- Practise counting objects that are placed in unusual arrangements.
 For example, they could be piled up or split into two separate piles.
 Encourage your child to place the objects in a line and then to point carefully as they say the name of each number.
