Important Messages:

Activities to try at home:

This week, the children have been creating and writing their own short stories. We have thought carefully about the features of a story. The children have created a story opener, setting, a character and what the character does. Perhaps you could encourage your child to write another short story at home!

Our sounds of the week are: 'ar' (car), 'or' (short) and 'ur' (turn). We have been focusing on reading and writing words containing these digraphs. At home, you could revisit these lessons on Bug Club or spot the sounds in a book at home.

In Maths, we have been exploring sharing and grouping. We have modelled sharing raisins to make equal and unequal groups. The children were quick to point out when they were not shared fairly and were unequal. At home, you could set up a Teddy Bear Picnic, using plates and small quantities of food e.g raisins. Ask your child to share out the pieces of food fairly so that each teddy gets the same. To further this, you could ask your child 'What will happen if another teddy joins the picnic?'
