### **Important Messages:**

We will be sending home the detailed breakdown of the areas of your child's learning on **Friday 28<sup>th</sup> May.** This will include the cumulative score and the current age band your child is in that was discussed during parent consultations.

We will also be sending home a phonics sound mat and tricky spellings for phase 2 and 3 on the same date.

On Thursday 27th May the children should wear full school uniform that day for class photographs. # Activity to Try

- This week we have been talking about the features of lists and why we use them. At home, you could encourage your child to write a shopping list, a list of ingredients or a list of items that you must then hunt for around your home.
- Our sounds of the week are 'ur' (fur)
   and 'ow' (cow). We have been focusing
   on reading and writing words containing
   these digraphs. At home, you could
   revisit these lessons on Bug Club.
- In maths, we have been focusing on taking away. You could support your child with this at home with resources that can be physically taken away, such as food. When eating, challenge your child to start off with an amount and ask them to take away a number. Using language such as first you had \_\_, then you took away \_\_ and now you have\_\_ will encourage a deeper understanding.
