Activities to try at home:

- This week we have been inventing The Gingerbread Man story. The children have adapted and created new characters using the familiar pattern of The Gingerbread Man story. At home, you could encourage your child to draw their story map and orally tell you their story reusing story language e.g Once upon a time, One day, First, Next, Finally, Luckily and Unfortunately.
- Our sounds of the week are 'ng, ai and ee'.
 We have been focusing on reading and writing words containing the digraphs. At home, you could write words containing these sounds and play bingo with a family member.
- This week we have been exploring the numbers '4 and 5'. At home, it would benefit your child if you could explore ways to make 4 and 5 using practical resources. The children are now recording two smaller numbers as a number sentence. To further this, you could hide one smaller group of objects under a towel or cup and ask your child to use their number sentences to identify how many are hiding.
