Activities to try:

Our sounds of the week 'c, k and ck'.

Can you find any objects around your house that contain the c, k or ck sound?

- We have attached our letter formation rhymes for you to reinforce at home. We teach the children the mnemonic as we introduce each new sound. At home, encourage the children to use the rhyme when they are writing.
- This week we have been exploring lengths. Ask your child to find some sticks or tinsel! Encourage the children to sort their objects by their length 'short' and 'long'. You could use the sticks to build a stick tree. Starting with the shortest stick and build up to the longest stick (see picture attached.)
