Here is what we will be learning this week:

- English learning through the story 'Where the wild things are' by Maurice Sendak.
- Maths practicing addition and subtraction skills using a range of resources to show understanding.
- Handwriting Writing all the letters, lowercase and capital letters, in their letter families.
- Phonics/spelling 'c' written as 'c' (cat), 'k' (kid), 'ck (clock)', 'ch' (chemist).

Reading

Over the next week we will be reading with each child to assess where they are, while we are doing this you have been sent two books, at your child's level, home to read. Please return reading books on Friday 15th March. A reminder that it is very important that all books are returned on Fridays so that the books can been quarantined before the books can be reassigned. You must bring back your book before another will be given out.

• When reading books at home please remember that it is not just about reading the words. As the children are now becoming more confident we are really starting to focus on comprehension too, it is incredible important that they understand what they are reading and can answer/ask questions.

Eye Tests

All children in Year 1 are to be offered an eye test in school.

All children whose parents <u>have not declined consent</u> for this test will be screened in school on the 23rd/24th March.

They will be testing the childrens' eyes to be sure they are seeing properly and that the eyes are working together as they should.

A letter will be sent home to all parents with the results of the test. There will be a contact number on this letter for any queries.

Reminders

- Please can you ensure that children bring water in a named bottle every day.

- Children should have a pencil case with pencils, colour pencils and a sharpener in school, these should all be named.
