

Year 1 | Our Week Ahead - 24/05/2021

Here is what we are learning about next week:

- English We are independently writing the story of Jack and the Beanstalk making sure we use punctuation, connectives, adjectives and varied sentence openers.
- Handwriting All midpoint letters: w, e, r, u, o, a, s, z, x, c, v, n, m
- Phonics Revising alternative spellings for /ee/ as in 'ee' in feet, 'e_e' in these, 'ea' in bead, 'ey' in key.
- Maths Quartering shapes and numbers using a range of physical resources focusing on the fact quartering is creating four equal groups.
- Science Revisiting what we have learnt this half term about plants and trees and looking at the life cycle of a sunflower.
- Geography Learning about the similarities and differences between the UK and Australian animals.

3 ways to read a book

Read to Self:

Students learn that there are three ways to read a book: read the words, read the pictures, and retell the story. Taking time to practice reading, allows children an opportunity to gain confidence as independent readers. Children should read books that are "Just Right" for their reading level.

Read to Someone:

It is important for students to read aloud to others. This gives children an opportunity to hear their own voice, work on fluency, practice reading with expression, and check for understanding.

Listen to Reading:

When students listen to reading, it gives them an opportunity to hear new words and expand their vocabulary. Listening to someone read allows a child to hear different types of literature and hear examples of fluent reading.
